**THE TRINITY IS LOVE**

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in *De Trinitas*, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three.

It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wranglings to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One-in-Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity.

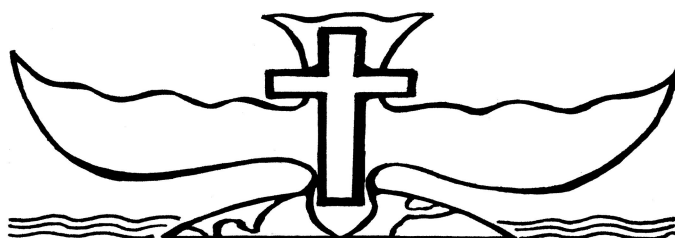

**PASTOR'S CORNER:**

**Very Unimportant Person**

If health were something money could buy  
the rich would live and the poor would die.

But God has made it in His mercy so  
that the rich and the poor to the grave must go.

This was a verse that I learned as a young man. I wish the sentiments were always true. People say "Life is not always fair", but perhaps it is people who are not always fair. The scriptures call us to be solicitous for those who journey through life with us.

God shows no partiality. Like a loving parent He loves all His children. Don Bosco, a priest from Turin in the last century, took his inspiration from the gospel where Jesus welcomed a little child and placed him in the midst of the apostles. Don Bosco had observed in his home town of Turin, how children were abandoned had no education and no prospects except to resort to crime. He founded a religious order, The Salesians, who dedicated their lives to welcoming and educating children.

On one occasion his work took him to Paris where he sought lodging with a local priest. The priest gave him a mattress on the floor because of his disheveled appearance. His host lived to see Don Bosco canonized. "If I had known that I had a saint in my house that night, I would not have given him such a poor welcome."

The way of the world is to honor the V.I.P.. But the way of the gospel is to welcome the **Very Unimportant Person**. "Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me, welcomes the one who sent me."

Lately I read where to hug someone, one must have empty hands and open hearts. We must have unoccupied time for those that God sends us.

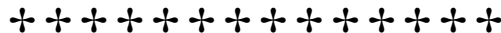
