Now as I read the daily meditations of Pope John XXIII I am blessed by the pope's messages.

After my friend Msgr. Higgins died, I received many of his books. Through Monsignor's and Carl's books I keep hearing their advice and encouragement. The Good Book tells us not to hoard but to share.
