


**TODAY'S READINGS**

### Carrie—A Gift From God

*Dearest Jesus, teach me to be generous

Carrie Ivins is a rare and special gift. Her faith was nurtured by her parents, family and community. Her Dad taught and shared the Bible, her Mom taught the First Holy Communion class and helped parents in bringing their children to Christ. Carrie would say "I wish I had a more professional training." Along with her sisters, Penny and Sandy, she had the best training in the world, a home like the home of Nazareth. She had a tremendous Love of Christ and fully believed that He was the Way, the Truth and the Life. She had the constant love of her husband, Tony and her children, Kristin and Eric. Like the prayer of St. Ignatius, Carrie was a giver, a very hard worker and gave all the glory to God. As our Parish Religious Education Coordinator, she modeled the love and concern of Jesus for all His people and especially His children.

As a co-worker, she was a gift to us and, please God, we were gifts for her. Every good and perfect gift is from above, and a person is a gift which above all others is from God. We know instinctively as well as from experience that every true gift has been given forever. Carrie and our love for one another are gifts from God, precious gifts that He will let us share forever.

Carrie shared the Lord with us, but she shared many other gifts, especially her husband Tony and her children Kristin and Eric. They are a very close knit family and at the weekend if you saw one—the others were close by. "Ah! Tony will do that", was a phrase I often heard.

Her office was opposite the priests vestry. After Mass, Fr. Innocent and I would go along with our parishioners, across the hall to see what abandoned animals she was taking care of. She would tell us what we needed to be doing for the parish and the children, she would always finish with "you can do it".

As Christians, we believe that God calls us to live a life that is fully human but that points to the Presence of God. "Go Make A Difference", is the first line of a hymn that Carrie sung with the choir. She has made a huge difference in our Faith Community. I also believe she will continue being a gift for her family, friends, co-workers, animal lovers and our community. Now we have another special advocate with God, and when you are thinking of doing something for God, you will hear Carrie say, "You can do it".
