**WATCH YOUR POSTURE**

Our posture is often a tip-off to our hospitality and reverence for the Lord. Note the actions of Abraham as he greeted the Lord in the presence of three men who appeared near his tent. He ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them. He bowed to the ground as he met them. He and Sarah, his wife, hastened to prepare a meal and bring food and water to their guests.

In the Gospel story, Jesus' friend Mary sat at his feet in order to listen to him speak.

How do we welcome and reverence the Lord? What do our actions show? Do we remember the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament? How do we welcome the Lord in the scripture readings? How do we acknowledge his presence in our brothers and sisters, both at Mass and afterwards?

Whether we kneel, stand, or sit in the Lord's presence, may our hearts and minds always be attuned to him.



### RELAY FOR LIFE

One Day. One Night. One Community. By participating in the American Cancer Society Relay For Life on August 18th and 19th at the Gold Country Fairgrounds. You will be honoring cancer survivors, pay tribute to the lives lost to this disease and raise money to help fight it, right here in your community.

This is much more than a walk around a track. Relay is a time to celebrate those who have battled cancer, remember those lost and get inspired to fight back. Those who have shared the same experience find common ground, hope and healing at Relay. By participating, you have the power to continue the American Cancer Society's progress toward a future where cancer doesn't take the lives of our friends and family.

The Knights of Columbus Council 6149 will take turns (1 hour segments) walking around the Gold Country Fairgrounds for 24 hours. While people are walking, there will be entertainment, speakers, time to relax and reflect, support, and companionship.

During the Luminaria ceremony held on Saturday evening at 8:30pm, each light honors the community's cancer survivors and commemorates those lost to the disease. Walkers will circle the track rimmed with glowing luminaries while the names of survivors and those lost to the disease are read aloud. Luminarias can be purchased for \$10.

The Knights of Columbus will have an area during the event which will have food, beverages, and shade from sun. Our team theme is "SURVIVOR".
