

**JOURNEY OF FAITH**

We are on a long and eventful journey. Today's readings for Trinity Sunday succinctly cover the depth and breadth of our human travels.

The very beginnings of our journey are revealed in the reading from Proverbs. God's plan filled with divine wisdom was born before the earth was made. In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of his own personal journey. He has come from the Father and will return to the Father. Only then will the Advocate—the Spirit of Truth—take us onward.

This does not diminish the fact that the journey will be hard. The very setting of the Gospel is the night before Jesus died. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, "We even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope" (Romans 5:3-4).

Ultimately, our human journey is modeled by the Holy Trinity—a family of love among Father, Son, and Spirit that we are all called to emulate.

We would like to thank the parishioners that have increased their weekly giving after our previous appeal. As you can see from the financial statement below, we are still operating in a deficit. Even though our collections have increased, we have had large expenditures along with higher operating costs this year. Efforts are underway to try and reduce these expenses where possible without reducing our programs or staffing. As previously requested, our goal was to average our weekly contributions at \$12,000.00. The yearly average weekly is \$9,968.00 for the first 40 weeks. This month (May) is lower and with the summer holidays approaching we know our projection will not be met.

To continue to grow our parish community, we ask everyone to please help balance our budget and volunteer your time and talents.
