



Efforts are underway to try and reduce these expenses where possible without reducing our programs or staffing. As previously requested, our goal was to average our weekly contributions at \$12,000.00. The yearly average weekly is \$9,968.00 for the first 40 weeks. This month (May) is lower and with the summer holidays approaching we know our projection will not be met.

To continue to grow our parish community, we ask everyone to please help balance our budget and volunteer your time and talents.
