

WHEN YOUR HUT IS BURNING

I always enjoy the Church bulletins that our parishioners bring back from their travels. Also, thank you for the short stories and the clean jokes that you share with me. Writing the pastor's notes each week has been a good discipline for me and I enjoy sharing parish updates and a story or two. My friend, Betty S. shared the following story with me.

"The only survivor of a shipwreck was washed up on a small, uninhabited island. He prayed feverishly for God to rescue him, and every day he scanned the horizon for help, but none seemed forthcoming. Exhausted, he eventually managed to build a little hut out of driftwood to protect him from the elements, and to store his few possessions. But one day, after scavenging for food, he arrived home to find his little hut in flames, the smoke rolling up to the sky. The worst had happened; everything was lost. He was stunned with grief and anger. "God, how could you do this to me?" he cried. Early the next day, however, he was awakened by the sound of a ship that was approaching the island. It had come to rescue him. "How did you know I was here?" asked the weary man of his rescuers. "We saw your smoke signal," they replied.

It is easy to get discouraged when things are going bad. But we shouldn't lose heart, because God is at work in the lives of believers, even in the midst of pain and suffering. Remember, next time when your little hut is burning to the ground—it just may be a smoke signal that summons others to our side through the grace of God."
