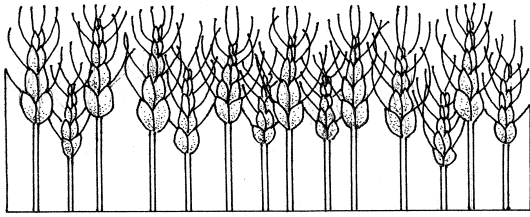

THE GIFT OF DAILY MASS

Every Catholic community mirrors different aspects of Christ’s life. Here at St. Teresa’s the prayerfulness of Christ’s life is always present. When priests are appointed to serve here the first thing to greet them at daily Mass is a chapel full of people coming together to pray for the Church and to begin the day in the Holy Presence of God. What a beautiful gift to God, to one another and to the priests that serve you.

Daily Mass allows us to celebrate anniversaries and birthdays. It helps us to reach out to God in tough times and when we cannot attend funerals we can join loved ones who are miles away in common prayer. Our Mass provides us an opportunity to say thanks, and to enjoy God’s abiding Presence. There are two communities at our daily Masses and each of these is strengthened and blessed by those who come for special occasions.

Lent and Advent are two special seasons when people make a greater effort to attend daily Mass. The celebrations are usually moved from the chapel to the main church to accommodate the larger numbers. The month of November is also a time where we try to attend a daily Mass for each deceased member of our families. As a child I was awakened to attend a daily Mass to pray for someone special. It was difficult getting up early, but I learned the efficacy of prayer and the importance of the Mass in the lives of my parents. Attending Mass or now offering the Mass is where I feel God predominantly speaks to me of His plans.
