

**GOD'S WAYS**

In the stream of readings during this portion of Ordinary Time one week's texts can often appear to pick up exactly where the previous week's concluded. The sentiments expressed in today's first reading seem to be a direct reaction to the Gospel passage we heard last week. In that Gospel, the landowner pays the same wages to his workers whether they worked for a full day or for only a few minutes. Today Ezekiel gives us the lament, "The LORD's way is not fair!" (Ezekiel 18:25). These Sundays in Ordinary Time offer us a glimpse into the ways of the Lord. We see how God's way has the tendency to turn the accepted conventions of the day upside down. Those who always expected that their way to heaven was guaranteed are disappointed. Those who thought they never had a chance are given that chance. Today offers us another opportunity to discover the abundance of God's mercy and love.

## ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

There are a number of Feast days that we can readily call to mind. The 4th of October is one such feast day for me. I went to a Capuchin Franciscan Boarding School so the Feast of St. Francis was one that we celebrated in liturgy and in remembering the life of St. Francis. After the High Mass, which was sung in Latin, we celebrated with excellent food and music.



John Bernadoni became known as Francis because of his early affection for French fashions and the French way of life. He is better known as a tireless worker for peace, simplicity of life and a lover of animals. In his day he and his followers invited all people to look at the gospel as a mirror and to make the necessary adjustment. Many people think of St. Francis as a rebel or a “Hippie”. Yes, he was counter cultural in that he chose the gospel way of life. His life and that of his followers were absolutely orthodox. They had a remarkable devotion to the Church, to the Sacraments and to the Pope. He sought and received recognition for his followers from Pope Innocent III.

Poverty, Chastity and Obedience were the vows that the Franciscans lived by. St. Francis’ first undertaking was to repair local churches that had fallen into disrepair because of lack of use. The Church had lost its credibility, it had moved away from the gospel values. St. Francis asked his followers to act humbly. He did not accept ordination to the priesthood, he stayed a deacon so as not to have the adulation of people. Joyful singing was part of his life as he and his followers moved from town to town.

Within ten years of their charter from Innocent III the Franciscans were five thousand in number. At their first general chapter in 1221, five hundred came seeking admission. The Franciscans preached in the language of the people and included non-ordained people in their order by establishing the third order. Men and women continued to work in their professions, raise families and lived a modified version of the Franciscan rule. The faithful shared the spiritual advantages of close association with the Friars through prayer and works of charity. Such was St. Francis humble and joyful life that he was canonized within two years of his death.

The life of St. Francis still challenges all of us today. The invitation is to sort through our lives and disregard all that is unnecessary. We are called to simplify our lives. Do not forget to bring your animals and pets for a special blessing on Sunday, October 5th after the 11:00am Mass (Circa 12:45pm).

**Auburn Interfaith Food Closet Ministry:** The Food Closet celebrates its 10th anniversary in November. The number of families we are serving has doubled since a year ago. In August, 747 families including 23 homeless, came to us for help. We distributed 19,296 meals that month. The increase in people served means that we need and that we rely on monetary and food donations from our local Churches and our community. We are always looking for volunteers to work 4—5 hours on the days the food closet is open. On the weekends volunteers can help with collecting food items from local stores.
