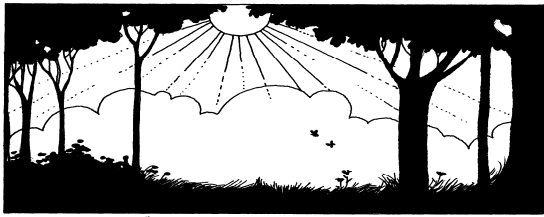

CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the Lord to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say "yes" to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

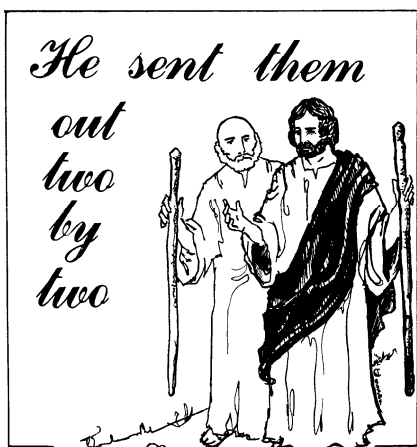

**CALLED TO BE A MISSIONARY!
SENT TO ST. TERESA'S PARISH COMMUNITY!**

In 1967 I left my native country, family and friends to be a missionary in the United States. This was done in response to my baptismal call and today's Gospel passage of St. Mark. When the disciples were commissioned they were given the authority of Jesus and the specific instruction about what they are to pack—**Nothing!** He does not say to travel lightly. He insists that they **take nothing** with them except a walking stick and sandals on their feet! They are to take no food, no bag, no money and no change of clothing. They are to go completely empty handed, which is just the way I came here to Auburn to the Sisters of Mercy with one little small black suitcase!

A Christian missionary today is to go out needy and vulnerable, so that there can be a mutual exchange of gifts between that person and the people to whom they are sent. Missionaries are to put on the clothes of others and eat whatever the local people share, thus becoming one with those with whom they share the Good News. So I am back among you once more just as vulnerable as I was decades ago when I taught 5th and 6th grades at the old St. Josephs School or 20 years ago when I was principal of the "New" St Josephs School. Will you share the Good News with me and break bread with me in this parish family as I hope to do with you?

Each of us by Baptism are asked to share in the spread of the Gospel. What is required of us today is to build community together that is not just mutually satisfying but also wide enough to hold our differences."What we need to carry out this mission is not a new technique, but a new sanctity; not a cooler dress, but a more inclusive embrace; not an updating of the gospel to make it more acceptable to the world, but a more courageous radiating of its wide compassion; not some new secret that catches peoples curiosity, but a way of following Christ that can hold more of the tensions of our world in proper balance so that everyone, irrespective of temperament and ideology will find themselves better understood and embraced by what we hold most dear."

Catherine McAuley, the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, left us this little saying. "We have one source of happiness in all our journeying—we can keep our hearts fixed on God." It is a pleasure to join you in this endeavor because that is why I'm being sent/recycled through St. Teresa's Parish again.

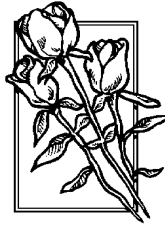

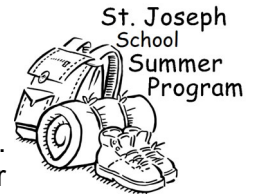
