

**WE LONG TO SEE GOD’S FACE**

“Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face.” This antiphon for today’s responsorial psalm offers the focus for today’s readings. As we on earth celebrate the triumph of all the saints—the ones officially canonized by the Church, and the countless others who have also reached heaven—we add nothing to their glory. But we give ourselves reason to hope. We, too, long to see the face of God and believe that we can one day be counted among those whose robes, as John tells us in the book of Revelation, are washed “white in the blood of the Lamb.”

The passage from John’s first letter offers further assurance: we are God’s children who will one day see God. But today’s Gospel pulls us past longing and reassurance into action. Jesus clearly tells us what we must do to be counted among the saints. We must be poor in spirit, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, and peacemakers! Then we, too, will see the face of God.



### The Power of One



A story surfaced in my memory—a story I heard from a commuter who uses a toll road daily about a phenomenon he had witnessed at the toll booths. Every morning, he said, there would be very short lines at five of the six toll booths, and a very long line at the sixth. Why would anyone join a long line, he wondered, when there were five much shorter lines available? The answer was the man inside that sixth toll booth. Without fail, he had a friendly, personal greeting for everyone who passed by his booth. “How are you doing today?” “How’s the family?” And even, in the case of my informant, the wholly unexpected inquiry: “What happened to your glasses?” My friend explained that even his family had not noticed that he had lost his glasses, but this stranger in the toll booth had not only noticed, but expressed his concern. Such was the power of this “one” that harassed drivers would line up, adding five or ten minutes to their commute, simply to be refreshed by this man’s friendly words and authentic kindness.

During World War II, it is reported, a battered contingent of defeated allied prisoners of war was being paraded through a German town. The streets were lined with onlookers, some with triumph on their faces, others with compassion. The prisoners were starving and utterly exhausted, their eyes cast down in despair. A silence fell. Then a woman broke through, an ordinary German housewife, and thrust a loaf of bread into one prisoner’s hands before fleeing back to her kitchen. She took the risk of compassionate action. She stepped out of line. But she also started a movement. Gradually others overcame their fears and brought out food for the captives. One woman’s action caused thousands to be fed.

Goodness is contagious. The power of one is always more than we can imagine, and “one”, multiplied by hundreds of us and directed toward the greater good of all creation, amounts to a very great deal indeed. Be the one!

### A Reflection from Ed Gilligan of the Stewardship Committee to illustrate the Power of One

Last Christmas Eve, I looked down at my wonderful wife of 49 years who had just passed away from cancer. You can imagine my thoughts—Why God, Why her and not me, etc. Even though she had the last rites three times, a priest from the neighboring parish came to the hospital room and prayed for her. Then he turned to me and asked me a series of questions about my long marriage, my family, my career, my many friends and my support of my parish. All my answers were positive and the Priest would respond, “How fortunate you have been. You have been blessed by God.” In my grief, it took me several months to fully understand that the priest was sending me a message how God had given me great blessings in my life. I was truly fortunate and needed to show my thanks.

At the same time I felt the love and support of St. Teresa’s Parish and my friends who showed me the true Christian spirit of support and love. This was important because during the first half of the year I also lost my only sister and my brother-in-law. It was not easy to realize that the people who did most had gone. I truly was helped by the message of that Christmas Eve and the support I received. During the months that followed, I volunteered to be on the committee to support the families that had been effected by the recent fire and the Stewardship committee. I was embarrassed to see how the other members of the committee were involved in so many ministries and I in so few. I realized I needed to develop a stronger and loving and loving relationship with God and my fellow neighbors;

I have committed to working with the CCD/RE program since my skills for 40 years have been in education. I am committed to working with the St. Vincent de Paul ministry to help the less fortunate since I saw first hand how our parish responded so well to the victims of the 49er fire.

I will never stop grieving for my wife but I have come through the process with the help of my family, The Grief Ministry at St. Teresa’s lead by Barbara Freuler and my friends. I will help anyone who has lost a loved one and faced the same road I have faced. I am making these commitments not only to honor God but my wife as well, who really taught me about God’s wishes to serve and sacrifice.

There are a number of great ministries at St. Teresa’s. I am committed to support these ministries with a steady amount of financial aid each month. This will help the parish pay down its debt and provide more funds for all the wonderful ministries.
