**LITURGICAL MODIFICATIONS
DURING FLU SEASON**

In order to help prevent the spread of illness during the flu season, Bishop Jaime Soto has asked that the following temporary changes be made in our liturgical celebrations:

- We are asked to **stop the distribution of Holy Communion in the cup.**
- You are encouraged to **receive Holy Communion in the hand** rather than on the tongue.
- The Sign of Peace should be offered **without shaking hands** (for example: a smile or a nod of the head while saying "Peace be with you.")
- We are asked to **dispense with the holding of hands** during the "Our Father."
- Those who distribute Holy Communion should **cleanse their hands with antiseptic solution containing alcohol before and after administering the Sacrament.**
- Ministers of the Eucharist who visit the sick and homebound should observe these same precautions.

Please remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill. It is a sign of consideration for others that those with flu-like symptoms remain at home.

These are temporary changes which are necessary to follow until the danger of flu season is past.

**MODIFICACIONES LITURGICAS
PARA LA TEMPORADO DE INFLUENZA**

Con el fin de evitar la propagacion del virus de la influenza esta temporada, el Obispo Jaime Soto pide que se observen los siguientes cambios temporales en muestras celebraciones liturgicas:

- Se nos pide que **cese la distribucion de la Sagrada Comunion con el caliz.**
- Se nos anima a que **recibamos la Sagrada Comunion en la mano** en vez de en la lengua.
- El Saludo de Paz debe hacerse **sin dares las manos** (por ejemplo: sonreir o saludar con la cabeza mientras se dice "La paz este contigo.")
- Se nos pide cesar la union de maos mientras se reza el "Padre Nuestro"
- Las personas que distribuyen laSagrada Comunion **deben limpiarse las manos con un antiseptico que contenga alcohol antes y despues de administrar el Sacramento.**

Los Ministros de la Eucarista que visitan a los enfermos y a personas internadas deben observar estas mismas precauciones.

Tengan a bien recordar que la obligacion de asistir a la Misa Dominical no se aplica a los enfermos. El hecho de quedarse en casa si se tienen sinto mas de influenza es un gesto de considercion hacia los demas.

Estos cambios, que son de caracter temporal son necesarios hasta que haya pasado la temporada de la influenza.
