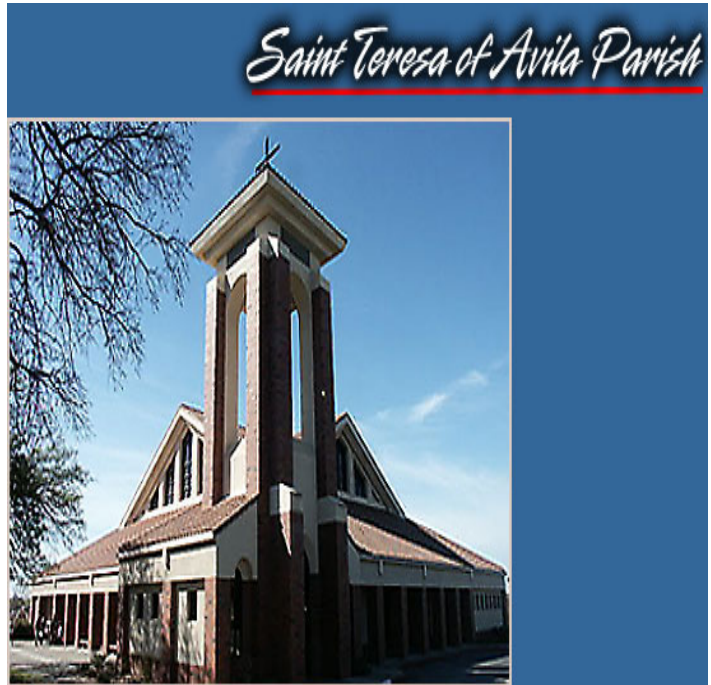
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

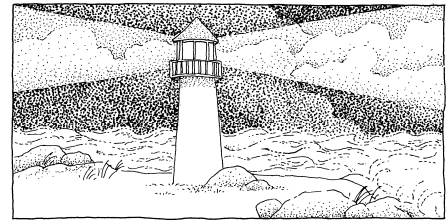

WHO ARE WE?

Who are "we" today as we sing "We are his people, the sheep of his flock" in the responsorial psalm? In the Gospel According to Luke we read:

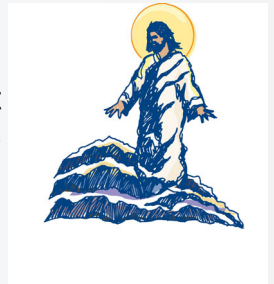

MYSTICISM

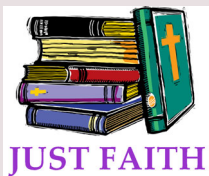
Why Religion can't live without it?

Excerpts from three great mystics for our reflection. The Sufi movement was dedicated to the quest for God through renunciation and prayer. Reflect on these words of the female Saint Rab'a al' Adawiyya 801. "I love thee with two loves, love of my happiness, and perfect love, to love thee as is thy due. My selfish love is that I do naught but think on thee, excluding all beside; but that purest love, which is thy due, is that the veils which hide thee fall, and I gaze on thee. No praise to me in either this or that. Nay, thine the praise for both that love and this."

St. Julian of Norwich astonishing illuminations: "In this he showed me something small, no bigger than a hazelnut, lying in the palm of my hand, as it seemed to me, and it was as round as a ball. I looked at it with the eye of my understanding and thought: What can this be? I was amazed that it could last, for I thought that because of its littleness it would suddenly have fallen into nothing. And I was answered in my understanding: It lasts and always will, because God loves it; and thus everything has being through the love of God."

Rumi: The poet who tries to push the limits of language in order to unite with the Holy. "I died as mineral and became a plant, I died as a plant and rose to animal, I died as animal and I was man. Why should I fear? When was I less by dying? Yet once more I shall die as man, to soar with angels blest; but even from angelhood I must pass on: all except God doth perish. 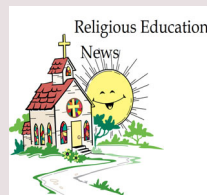

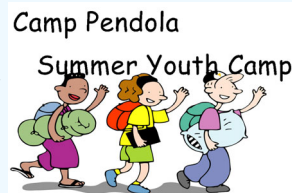
**WHAT ARE YOU DOING THIS SUMMER?
