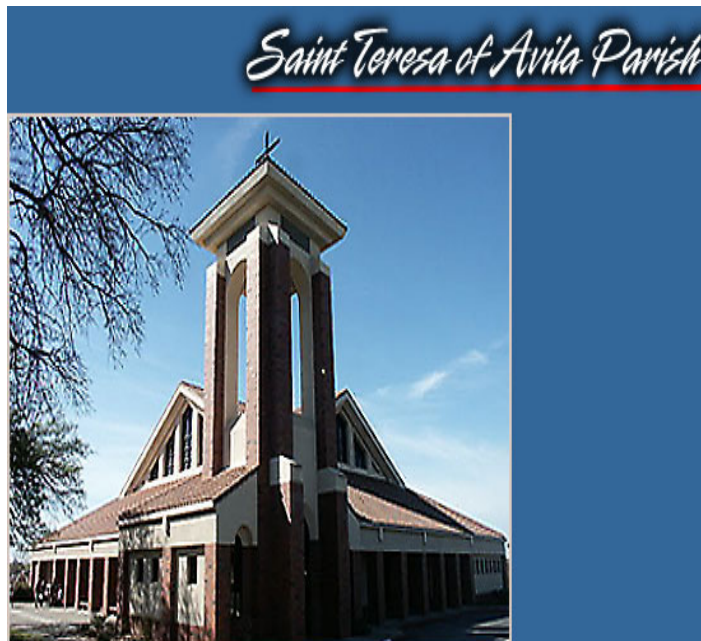
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

VALUES TO LIVE BY

Today's scriptures contain some catch phrases that are still quite familiar in our world: "All is vanity," and "Eat, drink, and be merry" are both scriptural in origin. In the same way that it is easy to pray last week's Lord's Prayer thoughtlessly, it is easy to let the potent passages of scripture that are built on these common sayings glide right off our slick ears.

Last week's scriptures instructed us to listen attentively to the Lord, so that we might pray carefully. Our listening and our prayer are intimately connected. In the same way, this week we learn that our values and our living are connected as well. It has become quite common to ask, "Do you own your possessions or do they own you?" Like the familiar maxims from today's readings, we might be tempted to quote this saying flippantly, and think that in the quoting of it we have truly considered it, perhaps lived it. Not true, Qoheleth, Paul, and Jesus tell us today. It is not wrong to treasure or cherish things of earth or of our own humanity; it is only wrong when those things we cherish are not of God, are not of the self-giving Christ.

SHARING YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH
(Part II)

Discipleship:

“Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence.” We are all called to evangelize and we can do this in simple ways in our everyday lives. (1 Peter 3:15)

Everyday Evangelizing:

- P**ray with your family on a daily basis. Establish family prayer rituals, but keep them short as children may not have the ability to attend to prayers for long periods. Short prayers of the heart have been urged by the saints throughout the centuries.
- S**hare a smile and a personal greeting with a stranger. Try to see Christ in everyone you encounter each day.
- H**ave a Mass said for a person in need and send them the Mass card.
- P**ray a rosary for evangelization in the world. Offer it up for the conversion of all who are far from the Lord.
- S**hare an answered prayer with a friend, co-worker or family member. Remember to give thanks for what you have received.
- E**vangelize your children by sharing a Bible story with them before bedtime.
- S**erve your parish as a Eucharistic minister, lector, choir member, etc.
- A**llow your faith to carry over into your work by insisting on fair prices, good products and fair treatment for customers and employees alike.
- W**ear a cross on a chain or other religious article to work. You may be surprised how many times this will start a conversation about your faith.
- S**hare your personal faith story of how God has worked in your life with a friend, coworker or family member.
- V**isit fallen away Catholics and invite them “home”. Never pressure them, but listen to their concerns and respond with loving concern. Pray for those who choose not to return.
- M**ake the sign of the cross when asked to pray at public events.
