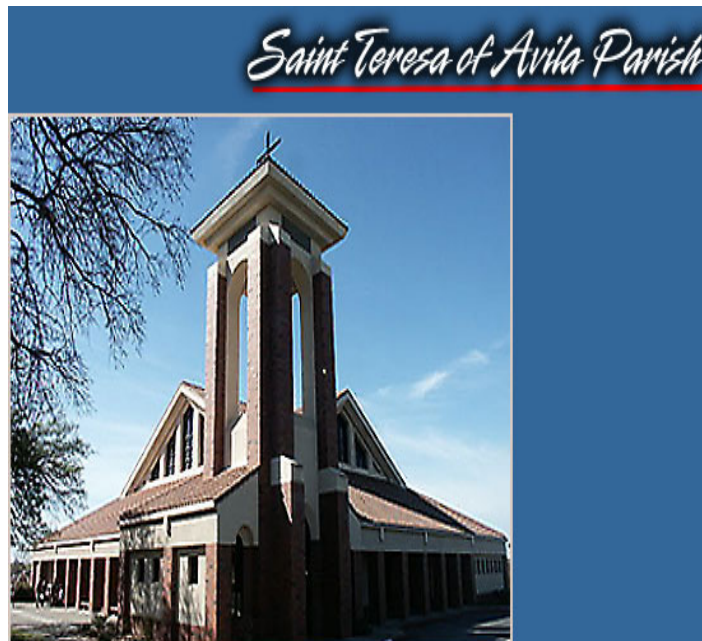
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

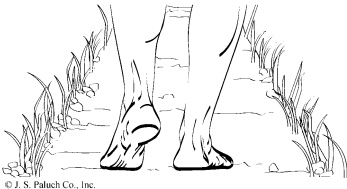

**Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time
August 22, 2010**

Strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees.
Make straight paths for your feet,
that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed.

— *Hebrews 12:12-13*

PROCLAIM GOD’S GLORY

A threefold message develops in today’s readings. First, everyone is called to proclaim God’s glory and receive salvation. Second, salvation is not for the unprepared. Like a loving parent, God gently corrects and disciplines those who have been called. Usually suffering is part of the formation process. We are to accept it as Jesus once accepted his cross.

Third, some people who imagine themselves saved are really not. The door of salvation has been closed in their faces despite their cries and pleas. On the other hand, some who are treated with contempt and disdain actually do have a place in God’s kingdom.

We need to take these lessons to heart. Recall your initial excitement on hearing God’s word. How has the Good News that once caught your fancy taken deeper root in your life? Look again at the crosses you have been given. How are others transformed when they see how you have accepted and grown from your sufferings?

Finally, are there some people whom you imagine are not invited to God’s kingdom? Why do you think so? For a moment, imagine them on the inside and yourself on the outside. How might this be possible?

Always try your best to enter by the narrow door. Come and proclaim God’s glory.

Click on Catholic Jobs Network and it will take you to the job website. The first step is to register to gain access to all of the services that the website provides.

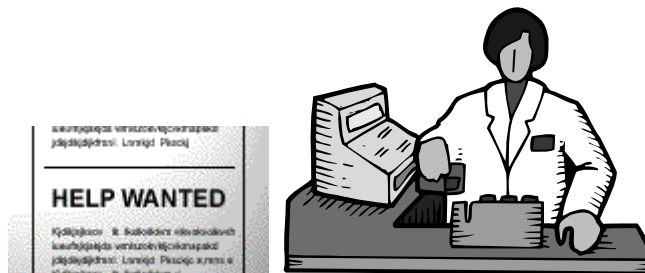
HOW TO POST A JOB

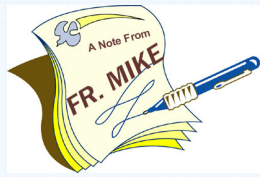
HOW TO POST A MINI-RESUME

Religious Education Program



Dear parents,

We are in awe of your commitment to your children's journeys of faith by showing them the importance of religious instruction. By enrolling them in our programs and bringing them to Mass each Sunday you are reinforcing your dedication. Please remember this is a lifelong process; you and your children do not graduate, but rather continue to deepen and strengthen your relationships with God.

The financing of this program, and our many other programs, are made possible by your tuition. Volunteering your time, talents and supplies keep our costs down and still enable us to have a quality program. We have not raised our fees for a couple of years now due to your participation. We are asking \$100 per child or a family fee of \$150.00. Just think, that only comes out to \$3.70 a class! The registration forms include ages PreK-7th grade. In addition, the Sacraments are crucial in developing spiritual growth. Therefore, in order to teach your children about them, we do need to charge for retreats. Confirmation, this year, will be \$100.00 as well as a separate registration packet. First Communion children will also have an additional form with a \$35.00 retreat fee. This money contributes to the speakers, retreat centers, supplies, food, books and many other expenses. If you cannot pay these fees contact our office and we can work with you. No child is ever turned away due to inability to pay. When your children are growing up, we hope they will remember and apply the valuable information learned in these classes and that their knowledge and faith will help them persevere through their roughest times.

We have added a second day of classes on Thursdays. Our hope is that this additional class will make it easier for families who cannot participate on Sundays to still partake in our program. Registration forms were mailed out last week. Please fill out the forms and send them in as soon as possible or we will be out on the patio after Mass for the next few Sundays. If you are new to our program, we kindly ask that you make an appointment to come by and meet us. This will give you a chance to ask questions and allow us to further explain our program.
