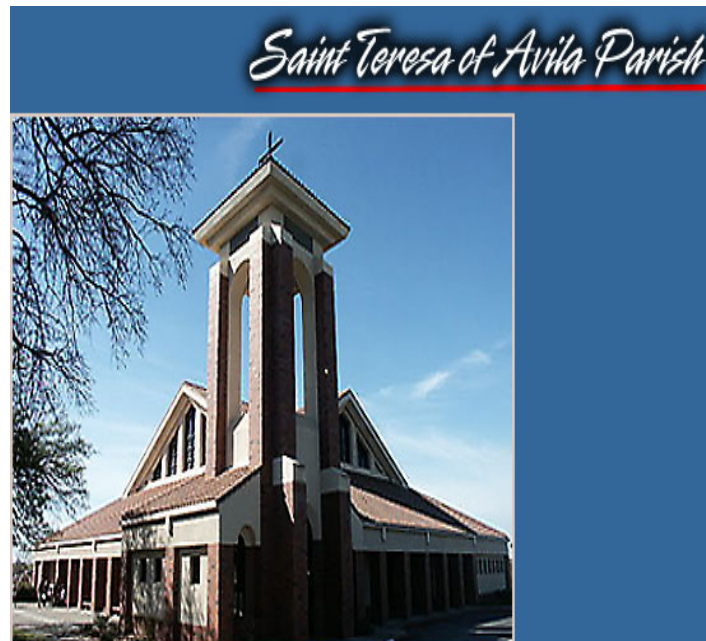
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

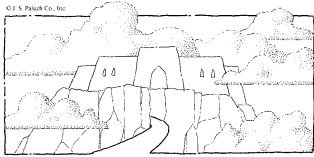

HUMILITY

The biblical virtue of humility often gets mistranslated in our world. Many think of humility as ongoing self-effacement or even self-degradation. Humility, as the scriptures use it, is a sense of true self-awareness, of one's capacities and abilities. A false humility is actually a kind of deceit, and is often a mask for the face of arrogance that lies beneath it. Thus Sirach today tells us not to seek what is too sublime for us, or to search out what is beyond our strength. We are called to have an awareness of what we are able to grasp, and with what we are strong enough to contend. Scriptural humility also has about it an openness to the goodness of others and what is best in them. That is why both Sirach and Luke's Jesus instruct us not to deny our own self-worth, but to be ready to elevate and acclaim what is good or great in others. When we live this way, we are closer to understanding how God views all of us. We ought not place ourselves, but others, first. In living this humble way, we are living out of the heart of God, who is always ready to raise us up in honor at the table of the heavenly banquet.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Parents are the primary educators of their children. In Catholicism, local parishes assist the parents in this sacred role. As Catholics, we are Eucharistic communities. The celebration of the Mass is at the core of our faith, Christ said "Do this in memory of Me."

Nine years ago on September 11th a terrorist attack killed over three thousand Americans. The World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and Shanksville, Pennsylvania, are forever imprinted upon our minds and hearts. The loss we felt, the empathy we had for the victims and their families was very personal. We cried, we prayed and we changed, especially when we saw the ultimate sacrifice of people who gave their lives because of love and duty. Families tried to telephone one another; mothers and fathers wanted to hold their children. September 11th has left us a loving and holy legacy, a legacy of wanting to put priorities in order with family, neighbor, and God.

In life, have you ever found in your quiet moments, that you need to make a choice between commitment and mediocrity? Jesus said to Peter "Get thee behind me." He needed a commitment from Peter. Christ saw the potential in Peter, Christ sees the potential in all of us as His disciples. I am asking our parish families to make a commitment to bring their families to Mass. At the baptism of our children, parents promise to share an active faith with those being baptized, sponsors (godparents) promise to be stepping stones to Christ.

This year we had two hundred fifty young people at our Vacation Bible School, thirty more attended our music workshops. I know there are a few hundred more children that need to grow in their faith and need religious education classes. Mrs. Jones, at my request, called religious education families who had not returned last year. All were pleased with the calls and promised to return this September. We need teachers, aides and volunteers to help in this sacred ministry.

Soon, the fireside room will be turned into the Religious Education Coffee Shop. No need to drop your children off and leave, now.....you can meet with Deacons David Ford and Ed Morgado, Sr. Anita and myself and share our faith over a cup of coffee.

Interfaith Food Closet: The Interfaith Food Closet is currently assisting 982 families from our community who are in great need, as 79 families of those receiving assistance have become displaced or homeless; and an additional 131 families have recently been added to the program. School is now underway and many of those families have school age children who have the ability to perform better in school, if they aren't attending school on a less than nutritional diet or on an empty stomach.



The food assistance program is a ministry that continues to provide for our needy year round, due to the help from our Parish Community members who contribute on a regular basis.
