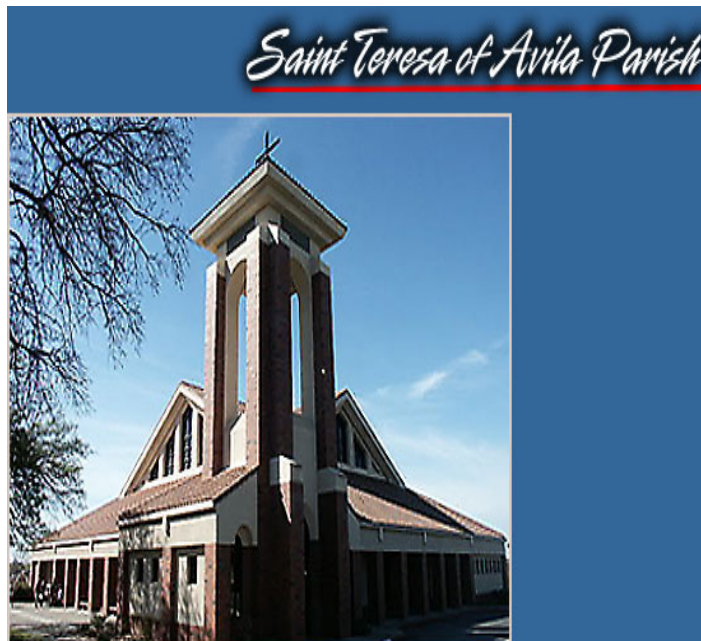
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

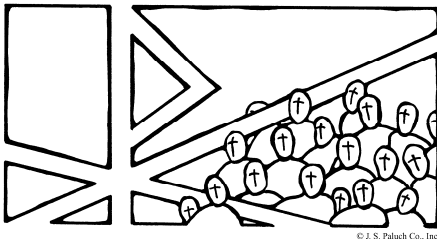

It is [Christ] whom we proclaim,
admonishing everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom,
that we may present everyone perfect in Christ.

— *Colossians 1:28b*

DON'T BE ANXIOUS

One can wonder how Luke's Gospel passage today might have been different if Mary, not Martha, had been the one to complain to Jesus, if Mary had said "Lord, look at her! Here you are sharing your wisdom and all she can think about is supper." Jesus may have noted, as Luke does, that Martha was burdened with much serving. Later in his writings, this same evangelist will describe in Acts how the early community set aside people whose ministry it is to see to the serving at table.

As a fully human person, Jesus knew the human needs that had to be tended. He doesn't deny this, nor does he chastise Martha for her working in service. He chides her for being anxious and worried. How can Martha—or any of us—be anxious or worried about the serving that needs to be done when we do it in the context of the Lord's will and wisdom? The Church has done more than any other institution to bear the heavy burdens of serving the ill, the uneducated, the suffering; has been "Martha" to countless of the little ones whom Christ told us were his very presence. But the Church has borne the burdens of service from the position of Mary: at the feet of the Lord, listening to and being guided by his word.

I enjoyed watching some of the World Cup Soccer games. I heard our parishioner Amy Lewis and her family, watched the final in Time Square, N.Y. Spain were the crowds favorite. The standard of soccer has improved worldwide, especially in the United States. Companies are making money from sports but they also put so much back into the game.

When I coached soccer I found so many other coaches willing to share their ideas and insights into the game. Their generosity and their helpfulness made it very difficult for me to give up coaching. Coaches share because they want to help every young person, it's good for the game, and no matter how old we get we still have so much to learn from each other. Over the years I have been fortunate to know so many people who have shared their tastes in good music, good movies, good restaurants and most of all good books.

A few years ago, a friend asked me if I would like some of Carl Ruben's books. Carl was Jewish. His father was Jewish and from New York, his mother was Catholic and from County Clare, Ireland. Each year he came to Christmas Midnight Mass to pray for his mom. Two weeks before he died he had asked me if he could take instruction in the Catholic Church. I do not know if he intended to become Catholic or if he wanted to understand his heritage and Catholicism a little more. His selection of books was phenomenal. There were books on Judaism, the Classics, World History, American Folklore, Irish Literature and a selection that totally surprised me - biographies and books on Pope John XXIII. Now as I read the daily meditations of Pope John XXIII I am blessed by the Pope's messages.

After my friends Msgr. Higgins and Brian Gallagher died, I received many of their books. Through Monsignor's, Brian and Carl's books, I keep hearing their advice and encouragement. The Good Book tells us not to hoard but to share.

ABSOLUTION

In the liturgy God pardons sinners through the words of absolution. The word “absolution” appears in two distinct places in the liturgy. In the sacrament of penance, the priest says the words of absolution, and Christ forgives the repentant sinner. At Mass the words that conclude the penitential act are called “absolution”, but according to #51 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, they lack the efficacy of the sacrament of penance. That is, these words at Mass do not intend to forgive sin in the same explicit way that absolution in confession does.

The first English translation of the absolution at Mass may have contributed to the confusion. The priest has been saying, “May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.” Through these words, the priest was asking for God’s forgiveness. But the original Latin text on which these are based never really made that request. The revised translation says more accurately, “May almighty God have mercy on us and lead us, with our sins forgiven, to eternal life.” The priest does not specifically request the forgiveness of sins. He asks God for mercy and for eternal life. He asks these blessings for those who have their sins forgiven, but the text leaves open just how that forgiveness is granted.

Catholics believe that God forgives our venial sins in many ways, even through a variety of the prayers we say at Mass and especially in the reception of communion. But the sacrament of penance is the primary way that serious sins are forgiven and the best way for all sinners to draw strength to gain the full freedom of the children of God.
