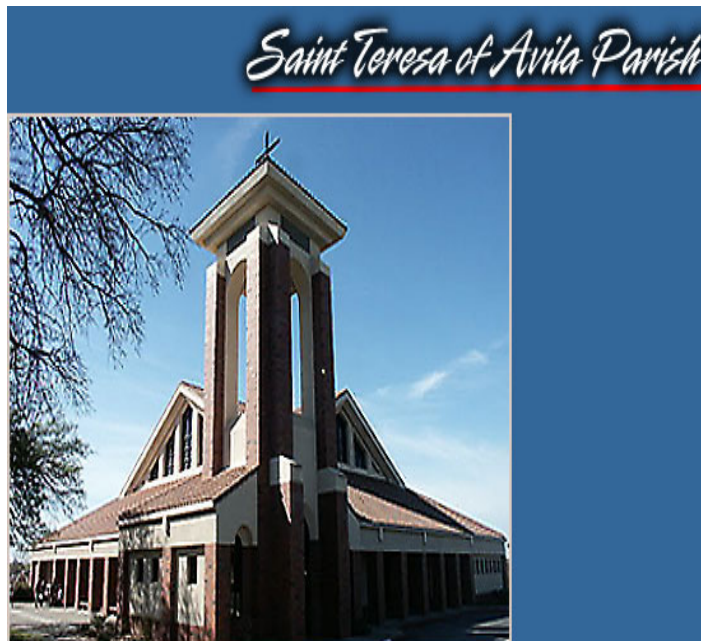
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

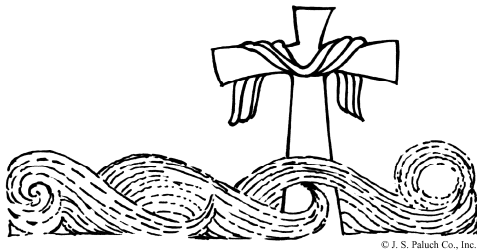

LISTENING TO GOD

Familiarity, in the case of the Lord’s Prayer, probably hasn’t bred contempt in most of us, but it certainly can breed a kind of inertia. The words we speak in prayer run the same risks as all our other human words: they can be spoken hastily, thoughtlessly, carelessly. In a manner parallel to the words we say in the Lord’s Prayer—“forgive us as we forgive others”—today might be the day to invite God to “listen to us as well as we listen to you.” Today might be the day to listen to the Lord’s Prayer with newly attentive ears.

Let us learn from the example of Luke’s Jesus, who would not instruct others how to pray until he himself had been a man of prayer. Moreover, listen carefully to the follow-up Jesus gives for the prayer itself. In our quick-fix society we must heed the call to persistence; in a world that puts glib explanations on difficult situations we must continue to seek and knock; in our all-too-humanness, we must be open to the patience, grace, and wisdom of the will of God. Do we want the Lord to listen to our voice? Maybe we can start by listening to God’s.

SHARING YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



Where would I be or what kind of person would I be if Jesus had not risen from the dead?

The Resurrection of Christ transformed death into new life. St. Peter's life was transformed from one of fear into great courage, hope and conviction. The graces of Easter are transforming and we too are asked to witness to the good news. Let us throw aside also the cloak of timidity and put on the cloak of hope and discipline.

St. Peter in his Epistle (1 Peter 3:15) tells us "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence". We are all called to evangelize and we can do this in simple ways in our everyday lives.

Everyday Day Evangelizing

- > Say "I will pray for you" to a co-worker who has shared some personal concern or difficulty.
> Respond "Thank God" when someone shares a success story with you.
> Make the sign of the cross as you pray before a meal in a restaurant.
> Display a religious article in your home.
> Ask someone you have hurt for forgiveness.
> Invite someone who has been away from the Church for a while, to attend Mass with you.
> Marriages and baptisms are wonderful opportunities for evangelizing. Make sure you make those in attendance who are non-Catholic feel comfortable by explaining the ritual ahead of time.
> Talk to friends and co-workers about the good experiences you have had with the Church.
> Take time in our life for those who are suffering or in need. Remember, people are more important than tasks.
> When you see God working in your life, point it out to others. We are enriched by the personal witness of others.
> Introduce yourself to new comers in the neighborhood and ask if they will be looking for a Church to attend. If they are Catholics, offer to accompany them to their first Mass at our parish.
> Warmly greet others at Mass whom you do not know. Sometimes members of our community fall away from the Church because they feel alienated from others in the congregation.
