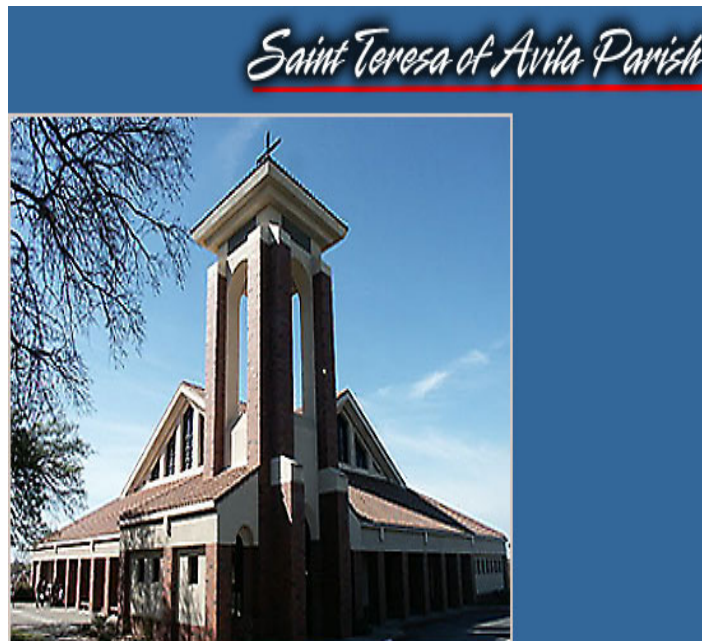
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

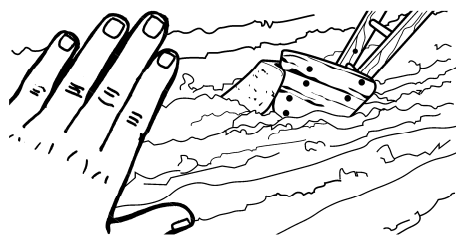

FOLLOW FAITHFULLY

When Elijah calls Elisha to follow him, Elisha goes back, momentarily, to finish some business at home. But note that he does not leave the work to be done by those at home, nor does he plan to come back and finish it himself. He recognizes in Elijah's call that he must follow faithfully and not look back.

Psalm 16 celebrates the loving protection of God for those who depend on God's love and mercy. God is our portion and cup, in a line seen by Christians as a poetic reference to Eucharist, and God will not abandon us to death and corruption, but will call us into the holy Presence forever. This could be seen as resurrection, something that was not universally believed in the days before Jesus. We are assured that if we go forth in confidence to follow God's daily call, we will not be shamed or abandoned, but will find the life we seek.

The Sign of the Cross

We make *the Sign of the Cross* before praying so that we may put ourselves spiritually in order; focus thoughts, heart and will on God;...after praying, so that what God has given us may remain within us. It embraces the whole being, body and soul, and everything is consecrated in the name of Triune God. *(Romano Guardini)*

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER...

At the beginning of the Mass the priest leads us in making the *Sign of the Cross*. We bow our heads as a sign of reverence at the invocation of the Trinity and we draw the cross of the Lord from our *head* to the bottom of our *chest*, from our left *shoulder* to our right.

By this sign we proclaim two fundamental truths:

- 1) The revelation of **God** as Father-Son-Spirit
- 2) The **salvation** we received by the cross of Jesus.

In the early Church it was customary to trace the Sign of the Cross upon the forehead. Over time, the Sign began to be made over the whole upper body.

Head: In the Old Testament priests, prophets and kings were marked/consecrated on the head. Remember that you have been marked on your forehead in Baptism. As you move down over eyes, ears, nose mouth and heart remember that you receive God's revelation in all your sense and nature, in faith.

Chest: The love of God manifested for us on the cross reaches our deepest inner self—our heart, where you plant the cross of Jesus.

Shoulders: Jesus liberates us from slavery of sin. We have to put upon our shoulders the gentle yoke of Christ's cross which is law of love and service.

In making the sign of the cross we can join the first three fingers (*symbol of the Trinity*) and curl the two last ones (*symbol of the two natures of Christ*).

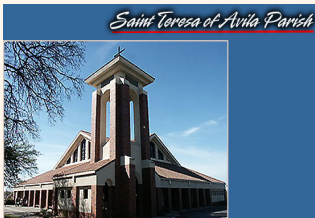
When you keep all fingers straight you symbolize the *five wounds* by which Jesus was crucified.

A pious practice observed by some people is, after having the sign of the Cross, to place their thumb over their index finger (curling the other fingers into the palm) thus making a small cross, which they kiss.

However you hold your hand, whatever you call to mind as you make the Sign of the Cross, **make it slowly and deliberately.**

Make it a prayer which encompasses your whole person, body and soul!
