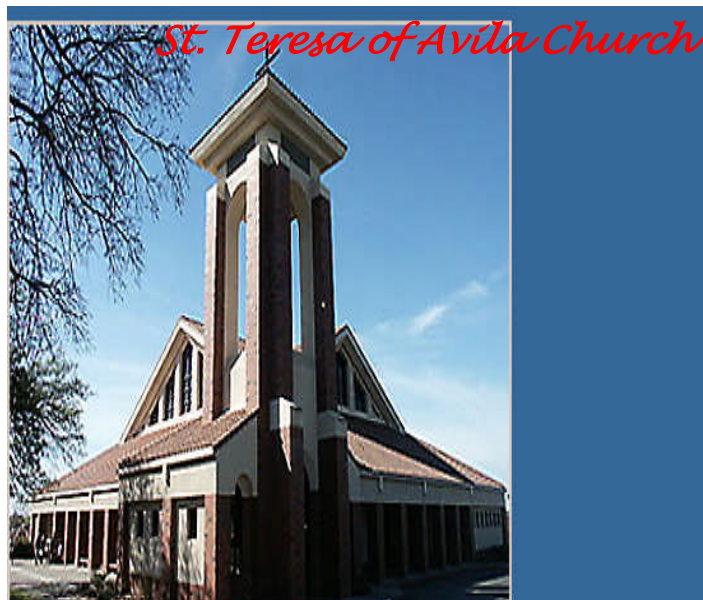
Baptisms: For the celebration of Baptism, please call the Parish Office, for information.

GRATITUDE FOR GOD'S CALL

If you were to write a letter to a friend or colleague, would you make a shopping list of your flaws? Might we all not, instead, chat about the events of life, our achievements, perhaps how our stock, or that of our children or others we know, has risen a bit? In his letter to Timothy, Paul reinforces the lessons of the scriptures of the past few Sundays: how we must humble ourselves, how our strength is in God alone, how we can be strong or exalted only in Christ. The fact that we are still standing in the presence of the Lord despite all our shortcomings is a sign of divine patience. Paul writes to Timothy that gratitude is his response to God's mercy, to God's grace and love poured out in Christ Jesus. Paul is grateful that God considered him trustworthy to be appointed to his vocation, his ministry to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ everywhere. In this, we are shown that our own response to God for whatever vocation God has for chosen us is to be gratitude. And that gratitude ought to refuel us to continue the mission of spreading the Good News everywhere.

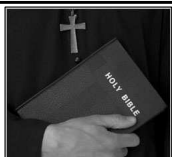

**SEPTEMBER 11TH, 2001
(Darkness came over our Land)**

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying out with a loud voice, said; "Father, into your hands I commend My Spirit." Having said this, He breathed His last. Luke 23: 44-46

This scripture tells us that what the friends of Christ experienced, and what we as Americans felt on September 11th. The apostles were lost and disoriented. Then, they did not know that darkness and sadness would not have the last word. That Christ's light would shine again at His resurrection.

On September 11, 2001, the curtain of the World Trade Center buildings was torn in two. As the building fell to the ground before our eyes, there was no color in the air—only dust. We also were lost and disoriented, but new lights began to come on for all of us. These new lights included the goodness of our fellow Americans, the unselfish efforts of the rescue workers, the President, our Congress and the city leadership in New York and Washington, the messages of love and faith from those who were dying, the world becoming one in grief, the prayers of all of us, and our belief in God and His promise of the resurrection.

Like many of you I watched hours of television which our presenters shared with us with such dignity and humanity. We owe it to our fellow Americans, to the World, and to ourselves to continue to rebuild and to be strong as a nation under God. On Friday the 14th, 2001, I saw and heard the CEO of Cantor Fitzgerald who lost 700 fellow workers, including his brother, say, "now I have a lot of people to take care of." He was having feelings of guilt for being alive, he had stayed home to escort his young son to kindergarten for his first day at school. He also shared that the rest of his staff from the other offices wanted to go to work the next day.....out of respect for their New York companions.

It is only right that we take time to mourn and pray and that we return to God for solace. All of us were left a legacy from 9-11-2001. That legacy includes hugging our children and spouse before we leave for work. This new light of faith was born out of the sacrifice of so many lives. This new light will be even brighter when we do not take for granted the sanctity and beauty of each life God creates.
