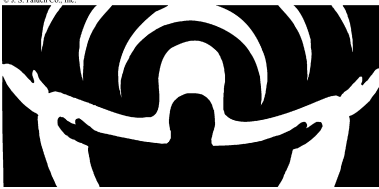

FOOLISHNESS

Sometimes the idea of repentance seems old-fashioned, naïve, even foolish. But if you're looking for real foolishness, you'll find it in today's readings.

We begin with Leviticus and the admonition, "Take no revenge and cherish no grudge" (Leviticus 19:18). We've heard that message before, of course, so we might forget how far it is from the so-called "practical realities of life." Saint Paul warns us about being practical, though. Whoever considers oneself wise had better "become a fool," because "the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God" (1 Corinthians 3:18, 19).

This "foolishness" continues in the Gospel: "Offer no resistance to one who is evil" (Matthew 5:39). In fact, offer the other cheek when you've been slapped. Hand over your coat as well as your shirt. Be like God, who sends sunshine and rain on the bad as well as the good. "So be perfect," says Jesus, "just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (5:48).

A special welcome to Fr. Michael McKeon who will be helping us here at St. Teresa of Avila Parish. Fr. Michael welcomed me to Presentation parish thirty-nine years ago. He came back early from a day rafting on the American River. He said "I wanted to see this new man from Ireland." We spent three years together then, and four more years at St. John Vianney in Rancho Cordova. Fr. Mike's last assignment was as

pastor of St. Rose of Lima in Roseville.

Fr. Mike has always been a great teacher and preacher, but he's most at home in taking care of the sick and the Lord's own special people. At St. John Vianney he started the food locker for Rancho Cordova. All the other churches thought the poor would not bring the right element to their churches. Fr. Mike said, "We must be doing alright if the other churches are sending us their poor."

At St. Rose he helped found Wellspring and the Lazarus Project, and was a strong supporter and contributor to the St. Vincent De Paul Society. Schools and Religious Education programs always flourished around Fr. Mike. This time around, it's my privilege to welcome my friend and fellow priest to St. Teresa of Avila. Years ago when asked how to distinguish one Fr. Mike from another, he answered, "I'm Michael Christopher and he's Michael Anthony." It is a blessing for me to work with Michael Christopher again.

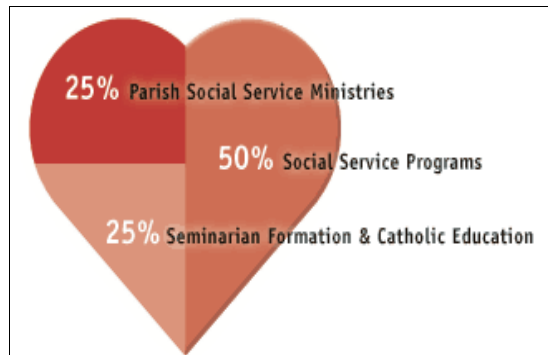


Annual Catholic Appeal
