LENT 2011

The Catholic Church invites us during Lent to make a pilgrimage, a sacred journey, towards Easter. There are parts of this journey that are private and there are other parts that are public, yet, at no time are we alone because Christ is with us. The paschal mystery of the suffering, death and resurrection should be our guiding light on this journey.

All our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving readies us to celebrate Easter. Formed by God's word let our prayer be in union with Christ and His Church. Let our fasting be done in union with Christ's sufferings and with those who are hungry. Let our almsgiving be in union with Christ's giving who thought not of Himself but of mankind. "Lent readies the faithful through closer attention to the Word of God and more ardent prayer to celebrate The Paschal Mystery." (Constitution on the Liturgy, 109)

LENTEN SERVICES AND PRACTICES

Ash Wednesday

Masses: 6:30am, 8:30am, 5:00pm (*Bi-lingual*)

Soup & bread will be served at 6:00pm

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting (one full meal and two small snacks). Ash Wednesday, and all the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence (no meat, please no lobster) These Lenten practices are meant to unite the Catholic family in doing something for God and His world.

LENTEN SUFFERING GARMENT

Each family is invited to choose a piece of cloth measuring six inch square, take time to pray with it and decorate it, then bring it to Church and place it in the basket provided at the gifts table at the rear of the Church. On Good Friday, our suffering garment will be draped over the crucifix as we united our sufferings with the sufferings of Christ.

CHURCH CHARITY BOX (*Savings we save by our Lenten Practices*)

1. Give up 1 regular coffee a day, $\$1.50 \times 45 \text{ days} + \$67.50 \times 500 \text{ people} = \$33,750$
2. Give up 1 regular latte, Monday, Wednesday and Friday. $\$4.50 \times 20 \text{ days} = \$90.00 \times 500 = \$45,000$
3. Give up 2 packs of cigarettes a week at $\$5.00 \times 14 \text{ days} = \$70.00 \times 500 \text{ people} = \$35,000$. For ex-smokers you may give the same as smokers just because you feel better.
4. We should all teach our children to give, having them give spare change out of their pockets. 4 quarters a week x 6 Sundays = $\$6.00 \times 300 \text{ children} = \$1,800.00$.
5. Give up a movie every two weeks, $\$10.00 \times 3 = \30.00 .
6. Give up a round of golf every two weeks, $\$25.00 \times 3 = \75.00 .
7. Give up a soft drinks 2 days a week.
8. Give up a glass of wine every 2 days.
9. Give up texting every other day.
10. Give up candy.

There will be a charity/donation box near the baptismal rock. Bring your gifts weekly and they will be part of our offertory procession. Our school and religious education children, along with our youth group will decide where 50% of these monies will go. The other 50% will go to our Christmas to Christmas campaign.

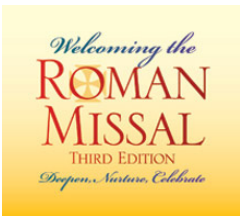


KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS BLOOD DRIVE AND BREAKFAST

HEALING OF GRIEF & LOSS

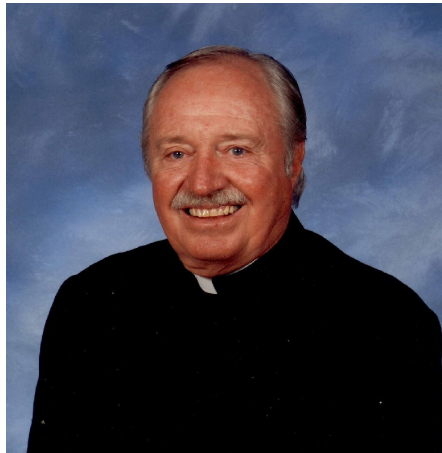

It is a pleasure to introduce to you

Rev. John C. Cusick



Father John Cusick, will be preaching at the parish mission at St. Teresa of Avila Church during lent. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1970, is the Director of Young Adult Ministry for the Archdiocese.

On July 1, 1985 Cardinal Joseph Bernardin appointed him the full-time Director of Young Adult Ministry. The Young Adult Ministry Office works with local parishes in their efforts at outreaching and inviting young adults to participate more fully in parish life.

As Director of Young Adult Ministry, Cusick has designed a number of programs, the best known is Theology On Tap, to assist young adults in their own personal understanding of the Catholic Faith.

John Cusick has preached Parish Missions throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago as well as in Colorado, West Virginia, New Jersey, Georgia, Arizona, California, Missouri, New York, Nevada and Ohio. He also has spoken at diocesan and national Young Adult Conferences, Evangelization Workshops, Religious Education Congresses and Parish Planning Seminars in the Archdiocese, around the United States, in Dublin, Ireland, as well as at The Convocation for Catholics in the Armed Services in Europe.

He has directed retreats and workshops for priests in the Archdiocese of Atlanta, Georgia; the Archdiocese of New York, Fort Worth, Texas and St. Louis, Missouri, as well as for the National Federation of Priests Councils. He has also conducted the Clergy Convocation for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City and the Dioceses of Wheeling-Charleston, West Virginia, Joliet, Illinois, Baker, Oregon, Rochester, New York and Salina, Kansas.

John Cusick is one of the fifty priests whose reflections appear in the book *The Last Priests in America, Conversations with Remarkable Men*.

Fr. Cusick has published an article, "Bridging the Generational Divide" in the Fall 2001 issue of *The Living Light*, published by the Department of Education, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Cusick was a member of the Steering and Implementation Committees for the National Pastoral Plan for Young Adult Ministry, *Sons and Daughters of the Light*, promulgated by the National Council of Catholic Bishops in November 1996.

On August 1, 2008 Fr. John Cusick and Dr. Katherine DeVries, his associate, launched the Ruah Project, a bold and aggressive outreach to young adults.
