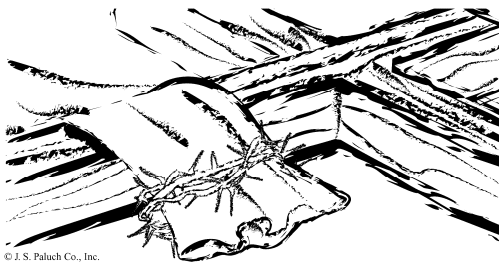

FAMILIAR INSIGHTS


Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians that he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

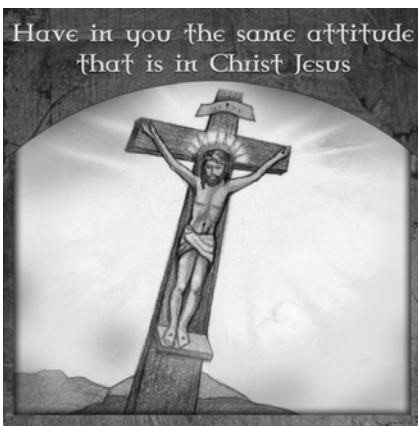

A wedding ring tells the world that the wearer has a special partner. Our national flag flown on special holidays says that we are patriotic and are proud of our country. Our parish church shows our neighbors the welcome we have for the Son of God and His Gospel message.

When a person speaks ill of their partner or their actions reflect unfaithfulness—then their wedding ring becomes a hollow sign. When someone is over critical of our country and it's institutions, or when a person is over critical of the Catholic Church then their actions lessen the respect and credibility for these institutions.

If our parish community reflects kindness, the welcome and forgiveness of Christ, then it is easier for us to believe in a kind, welcoming and forgiving God. Our actions do have a large influence on our families and friends and to a lesser degree on all those we meet.

The older I've grown the more characteristics and the qualities of my parents and early church are alive in my life; the attributes of those I've lived with and those who have influenced me are also present. No good deed or no good example are totally forgotten. As individuals we are all gifted with God's spirit, yet we also embody the presence of those who have influenced our lives. When we live our faith our deceased family and friends live on amongst us but most of all Christ lives through us.

St. Teresa of Avila expressed it centuries ago:

*Christ has no body on earth but yours;
No hands but yours;
No feet but yours;
Yours are the eyes through which He is to look out
Christ's compassion to the world;
Yours are the feet
With which he is to go about doing good;
Yours the hands with which he is to bless now.*

Welcoming the ROMAN MISSAL THIRD EDITION

Deepen. Nurture. Celebrate

INTRODUCING THE NEW MISSAL

Where do I find the changes in the people's prayers at Mass? The Mass missalette and the congregational card will have all the prayers and responses that are changing.

There are new translations of 'I confess', 'Glory to God in the highest', the Creeds, the acclamations in the Eucharistic Prayers, 'Lord, I am not worthy' and a number of other prayers and responses, which are very slightly changed; for example, in the Holy, Holy, we say 'Lord God of hosts' and in the response to 'Pray, brothers and sisters', the addition of one word, 'holy' before 'Church'; where we responded 'And also with you', we now say 'And with your spirit'.

Why the response, 'And with your spirit'? This response "And with your spirit" is one of the very obvious changes as we use the new edition of the Missal. When the priest proclaims 'The Lord be with you', the new response from the congregation, 'And with your spirit', will replace the wording of the previous response which occurs before the Gospel, at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer and at the Blessing at the end of Mass.

'And with your spirit' is the literal translation of what we find in the Latin text, '*et cum spiritu tuo*'. This translation is already found in other languages, for example, German, Italian, French and Spanish.

Scripture is very much the source for this dialogue between priest and people. In four letters of St. Paul he uses the following greetings: Galatians 6:18—'May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit'; Philippians 4:23—'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit'; 2 Timothy 4:22—'The Lord be with your spirit'; Philemon 25—'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit'. Similar greetings can be found in the Old Testament.

What does 'your spirit' mean? It is not a reference to the Holy Spirit, though it is spoken by people who live according to that Spirit. For St. Paul the spirit is our spiritual part that is closest to God. 'And with your spirit' is about having the spirit or mind of Christ as your guiding light, as what guides us through the day—a Christian spirit.

While it will sound unfamiliar to us, this greeting and response captures our biblical roots. It is recognition the spirit that is among us as Christians, a spirit that we must live, and in greeting one another, it proclaims the presence of Christ among us.
