— Deuteronomy 6:5

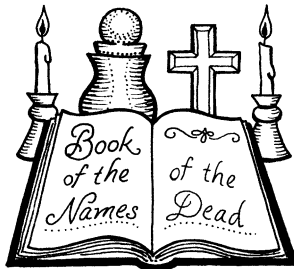
LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O LORD, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.

PRINCIPLES & VALUES

The devastation of Hurricane Sandy reminds us that we do not write the script for our lives. The Liturgy readings for November ask us to re-examine our values and the principles by which we live our lives. I want to share with you St. Ignatius' principle for living one's life.

*"I believe that God created me to share my life and love with Him and other people, forever.
I believe that God created all other things to help me achieve this lofty goal.
I believe, therefore, that I should use the other things God created insofar as they help me attain my goal and abstain from them insofar as they hinder me.
It follows, therefore, that I should not prefer certain things to others.
That is, I should value, automatically, health over sickness, wealth over poverty, honor over dishonor, or a long life over a short one.
I believe my sole norm for valuing and preferring a thing should be this:
How well does it help me attain the end for which God created me?"*

At St. Teresa's when we celebrate the Mass together we give Glory to God, but we also share our lives with each other. You might have noticed we have many of the homeless attend Mass with us especially at 8:00am and 10:30am Masses. Thank you for welcoming and giving.
