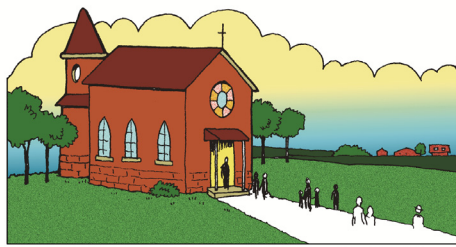

Christ Jesus . . . is the head of the body, the church.
— *Colossians 1:15, 18*

LIVING GOD’S COMMANDS

The first reading forms part of Moses’ farewell discourse, a call to the people to return to God. It is not a legalistic summons; rather, it is an appeal to heart and soul. It outlines a command that is not impossible to follow, or too difficult to undertake, or too expensive. Look into your hearts, says Moses; there you will find what to do.

Paul sees Jesus Christ as the image of God, the agent of creation and preservation. We sense, in his words, things profound: “dominions or principalities or powers.” But in the midst of that, Paul keeps his attention on Jesus Christ, head of the church. It is in Christ that we find fullness and reconciliation—in the blood of the cross.

Luke’s Gospel illustrates the double commandment of love with the story of the Good Samaritan. The story is a radical one, for it comes to focus on the question of who my “neighbor” is. That neighbor is not identified with any group, but rather by the scope of our compassion.

Faithfulness is as precious as a beautiful diamond, and today almost as rare. Faithfulness is what the Lord wants from us by the end of this earthly journey. "Come thou good and faithful.....Inherit the Kingdom." Faithfulness is not an easy road, for one has to sacrifice one's own pleasures, comforts and interests. Where do I as a mother, father, daughter, son or catholic, make sacrifices? Faithfulness requires not only physical strength but strength of character. Though one has to pay a price.....it brings rewards. Doing what the Lord asks and expects.....brings peace and joy.

How do I fulfill my obligations to be faithful? Is my life an example of faithful service? "Whoever wishes to become great amongst you must be your servant." One has to master oneself in order to serve others. There is always the temptation to seek one's own advantage and not the greater good. A parent missing Mass for sports, a morning in bed, or the thought, "Who will notice?" is less than faithful. Our lives are not entirely our own when we are in leadership roles either at home or at work.

Life must be lived for a cause greater than our own pleasures. Life is at it's brightest when we are faithful to the Lord, to our marriage partner, to our children, to our parents, and to our neighbor. Those who are faithful are fortunate, those who are not faithful need to make new beginnings. The psalms tell us, that the faithful sentinel (watchman) looks forward to the dawn. Again, Christ will recognize the faithful and they will have a place of honor in His Kingdom.

Why do we come together to celebrate The Sunday Mass? The tradition lives on in the telling and the living of The Story. Faithfulness is embodied in the action of breaking bread. VIVIR LOS MANDAMIENTOS DE DIOS

La primera lectura forma parte del discurso de despedida de Moisés, un llamado al pueblo a volver a Dios. No es un mandato legalista sino más bien un ruego al corazón y al alma. Esboza un mandamiento que no es imposible seguir ni muy difícil de cumplir, ni muy costoso. Miren en sus corazón, dice Moisés; y sabrán que hacer.

Pablo ve a Jesucristo como la imagen de Dios, el agente de la creación y de la preservación. Detectamos, en sus palabras, cosas profundas: “gobiernos, autoridades, poderes y fuerzas sobrenaturales”. Pero en medio de todo esto, Pablo mantiene su atención en Jesucristo, cabeza de la Iglesia. Es en Cristo que encontramos satisfacción y reconciliación –por su sangre derramada en la cruz.

El Evangelio de Lucas ilustra el doble mandamiento del amor con la historia del Buen Samaritano. La historia es radical porque enfoca la pregunta ¿Quién es mi “prójimo”? Ese prójimo no se identifica con ningún grupo sino más bien por el alcance de nuestra compasión.

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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Desde 1913, en la ciudad de Puntarenas, Costa Rica, la Virgen del Carmen es reconocida como la Virgen del Mar. En aquel año un barco llamado el Galileo naufraga en una tempestad y el pueblo angustiado por sus seres queridos recurrió al templo de la Virgen para pedir auxilio. Algunos días después todos los tripulantes fueron rescatados y llevados a Puntarenas. Según los tripulantes, mientras las lluvias y vientos amenazaban al Galileo una mujer los animó a que se echasen al agua y nadaran a tierra firme. Allí ella los alimentó y los acompañó hasta que fueron rescatados.

Llenos de alegría, el pueblo llevó a los rescatados a la iglesia para dar gracias. Estos reconocieron a la Virgen del Carmen como la mujer que los había ayudado. Desde entonces el sábado más cercano al 16 de julio, el pueblo celebra en grande la fiesta del Carmen con grandes desfiles de barcos y yates. Entre música y fuegos artificiales los costarricenses vienen en embarcaciones adornadas desde toda la nación a celebrar con la Virgen del Mar que también se encuentra en una embarcación.
