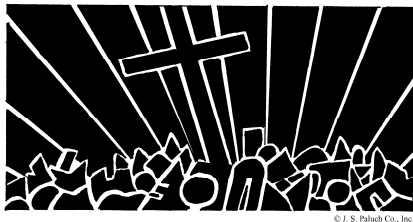

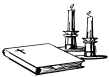

FORGIVEN

Today's liturgy continues the message of forgiveness and reconciliation that we heard last week. The Church seems to be doing its utmost to deliver one simple message: "Your sins are forgiven!" What good news this is!

Isaiah declares that God's saving action on our behalf is not something trapped in the past, but here and now. Paul urges us to recognize that true life is not "won" by following laws, however strictly, but is a free gift of God. Thus, our focus must be on the future, not on past misdeeds. Our eyes must be on the prize of life forever with God.

In the Gospel, Jesus is challenged to demonstrate that he is a law-keeper, but he knows that this is a trap. If he counsels mercy, he will be declared an opponent of the law. If he follows the law and condones its punishment, he will be denounced as an inciter to murder. Jesus decides to do neither. Instead, he turns the tables and invites the crowd to forgo "legality" for the sake of forgiveness and reconciliation.

**"HABEMUS PAPEM"
"We Have A Pope"**

Jorge Mario Bergoglio (S.J.), Cardinal Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina, is our new Pope. To be honest I was hoping that Sean O'Malley of Boston might be Pope. Not because of his Irish name but because of his background as a Capuchin Franciscan. Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio has taken the name Pope Francis I. I hope you are as delighted as I am.

When St. Francis entered a dilapidated church, a broken crucifix spoke to him and said, "Rebuild my Church." It is providential that the Holy Spirit has chosen Pope Francis I to rebuild his church. The television commentators shared that our new pope is a man of great humanity. When elected Archbishop, he gave up his chauffeured limousine and traveled by public transport. He moved from a palace to a small apartment. He also, until now, cooked his own meals.

Pope Francis I, was born of immigrant Italian parents in Argentina on December 17, 1936. He is a member of the society of Jesus (S.J.). He had great courage in his dealings with the military Junta in his homeland. Besides his doctorate in theology, he also has a degree in chemistry. He has been a seminary president and professor, and a great church administrator.

His keen mind, scholarship, administrative experience and dealing with a hostile government gives Pope Francis I, great gifts to lead our church. But his sense of prayer and presence when he was introduced as Pope will bless all of us. His first greeting from St. Peter's balcony was "Dear Brothers and Sisters,. . . .The conclave have chosen someone from far away,. . . .let us pray for Pope Benedict. . . Let us begin our journey together . . . Let us pray for one another, . . .Let us pray for the whole world, . . .Let us pray for brotherhood. Let our journey be one of evangelizing. First a favor before the blessing—Let us pray in silence,. . . please pray for me".

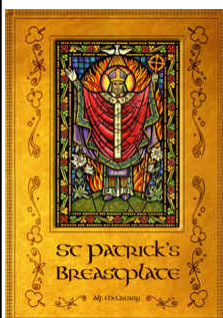
