First Sunday of Lent

March 9, 2014

“The Lord, your God, shall you worship
and him alone shall you serve.”

— *Matthew 4:10*

THE WAY OUT

Today’s readings launch us into Lent with the story of salvation. How did we humans get where we are? How do we get out? Genesis—through the Adam and Eve narrative—explains that we got separated from God and happiness through greed, selfishness, arrogance.

But, as Paul explained to the Romans, God has not abandoned us, and never will. We get out through the “new Adam,” Jesus Christ, through whom the death of sin is conquered by the life of “overflowing grace.”

From the start, though, Jesus—like Adam and Eve, like you and me—had to face “the tempter.” Shown fame and wealth, he was tempted to grab for it. But Jesus saw through such foolishness. During Lent we will look at what the tempter spreads before us daily, then try to make choices that put us on the side of the angels.

The Bishops' Series, Voices from the Leadership of our Church



Join us Monday evening, March 10th at 7:15pm. Archbishop George H. Niederauer will give a talk on Faith and the Arts. Almost all of us are either artists (exploring music, writing, dance, etc.) or we are 'consumers of the arts' - going to movies, reading books and novels, enjoying art and dance, etc. The Archbishop will explore how artists relate to our challenging culture with our Christian faith in mind. How do we as Christians engage the arts in our culture? He will be looking at the arts through a faith-based lens utilizing his unique background as Professor of Literature and Cinema.

Archbishop George is known for his quick wit and sense of humor. A native Californian, he was ordained for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in 1962 and received a Doctorate in English Literature in 1966 from USC (University of Southern California).

Twenty-seven years of his priesthood was spent as a Professor, Spiritual Director, and Rector at St. John's Seminary College and Theologate. He was appointed Bishop of Salt Lake City (encompassing all the Catholic community of Utah) in 1994 where he served eleven years and was appointed Archbishop of San Francisco in 2005 retiring in 2012.
