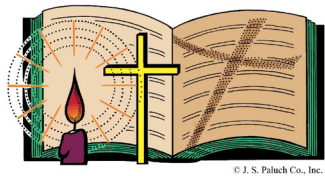

Christ Jesus . . . destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. — 2 Timothy 1:10b

SEEING THROUGH

Today's readings invite us to look more deeply, to catch a glimpse of Divine Reality hidden within the "stuff" of life. God challenged the elderly Abram and his wife to leave home for a land that God would show them. Their eyes would see the land, but only God could "show" it as a divine gift. Paul reminded Timothy that God's grace had always been available, but in Jesus Christ was made "manifest."

Jesus called Peter, James, and John up the mountain and was "transfigured" for a moment, the radiance of God shining through. Then, just as abruptly, the three looked up . . . and saw only Jesus.

During Lent we're invited to "see through" to God's presence in the stuff of life: prowling the supermarket, waiting in traffic, arguing with the kids, cleaning the bathtub. We wouldn't really have to "do" anything, if we could only glimpse divine love supporting us, holding us together.

IRISH ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY

As salmon return to their own rivers to spawn, and as migrating birds always return to the places of their birth, so do the Irish return to the land of their ancestors. Each visitor to Ireland is welcomed like family, because most visitors have their ancestral roots in Ireland.

Barack Obama's great grandmother, on his mother's side, comes from County Offaly. Many past United States President's have Irish connections; Clinton, Nixon, Reagan, Kennedy, Grant, Jackson, Wilson, Cleveland, McKinley and Arthur. Other political names include O'Neil, Daley, Moynihan, Lahey, Carroll, Biden, Smith and Brown. Hollywood has had its share of Irish Americans; Disney, Ford, Cagney, Crosby, Tracy, O'Hara and O'Brien.

Notre Dame "The fighting Irish" seem to have captured the spirit of Ireland, "No matter the odds, we have a great chance." "The bigger they are, the harder they fall." This was a line John L. Sullivan said when he took on all corners, especially men who were built like trees. Boxing historians said he won over two hundred bouts. Jack Dempsey, the "Manassa Mauler" also added to the Irish American reputation of toughness.

Cornelius McGillicuddy, Walter O'Malley and Art Rooney owned sports franchises. Eugene O'Neill and F. Scott Fitzgerald were mighty with the pen. William F. Buckley and Tim Russert brought political debate into our front rooms. Henry Ford gave us the Model T.. Cyrus McCormick and John P. Holland were inventors. John Barry was the father of the U.S. Navy. George Meany was the leader of the AFL-CIO. John Carroll was the first Catholic Bishop of the United States, and Fr. Flanagan and Fr. Theodore Hesburgh added to the visibility of the Catholic Church in America.

These are but a few, who have made us proud of our ancestry. Most of us on St. Patrick's Day will remember different people, like our grandparents, and the religious sisters, brothers and priests who gave us a great education and the belief. . . . that with God we do make a difference in this great land which God has gifted us, America.

When I arrived in the Diocese in 1972 most of the priests were Irish. Now, there are seven of us in active ministry. This St. Patrick's Day, Bishop Jaime Soto is going to dedicate a stained glass window in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament to the Irish priests who served in the Diocese of Sacramento. St. Patrick, patron of our Diocese, pray for us.

Pablo recordó a Timoteo que la gracia de Dios siempre ha estado a nuestra disposición, pero que en Jesús se “manifestó”.

Jesús invitó a Pedro, Santiago y Juan para que subieran al cerro y allí se “transfiguró” por un momento, y el resplandor de Dios brilló a través de él. Luego, con la misma rapidez, los tres miraron. . . y sólo vieron a Jesús.

Durante la Cuaresma se nos invita a “mirar más allá” para ver la presencia de Dios en las cosas ordinarias: ambulando por el supermercado, esperando en el tráfico, discutiendo con los hijos, limpiando la bañera. No tendríamos que “hacer” nada más si pudiéramos divisar el amor divino que nos apoya y nos sostiene.
