FEAST ON CHRIST

The Prophet Hosea invited the chosen people to spend time in the place where they first encountered the Love of God. The desert was where the people knew the intimacy of God's presence. It was where they honeymooned with God.

Christ at the beginning of His public ministry was led by the Spirit into the desert to spend time with God His Father. This quiet time, despite the temptations, helped Him prepare for the new direction His life was taking.

Married couples also try and return to the special places of their courtship and honeymoon. There they celebrate their sacred covenants and they empty themselves of the demands of family, work and the cares of the world. During our Lenten journey of forty days, we are emptied so we can be filled with God's Love and Bounty. Lent allows us to unclutter our lives. Lent can be our "desert" or "honeymoon", in that we can re-establish our intimacy with God and celebrate our Sacred Covenant with God.

Reverend Gillespie, a retired Presbyterian minister, suggests that Lent is not so much fasting but feasting on God's Presence.

- Fast from junk foods; Feast on the Bread of Life.*
- Fast from bad news; Feast on "The Good News."*
- Fast from darkness; Feast on the Light.*
- Fast from the secular; Feast on the Sacred.*
- Fast from despair; Feast on Forgiveness.*
- Fast from tears of sorrow; Feast on tears of Joy.*
- Fast from getting; Feast on Giving.*
- Fast from horror; Feast on Humor.*
- Fast from complexities; Feast on Simplicities.*

FAITH ENRICHMENT DURING LENT

Bishop Blaire of Stockton to speak at St. Teresa of Avila on Monday March 24



Bishop Stephen Blaire of Stockton will speak on “The Church: A Voice for the Poor,” on Monday, March 24 at 7:15 p.m. at our Church this coming Monday night.

The bishop’s talk is the second of three talks sponsored by the parish during Lent, titled “Finding Christ in the World: The Bishops’ Series, Voices from the Leadership of Our Church.”

Bishop Blaire recently concluded a three-year term as chair of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, where he represented the U.S. bishops on a host of issues, including labor and employment, the federal budget, agriculture, domestic poverty, rural issues and the death penalty. Previously he also served the USCCB as chairman of the Pastoral Practices Committee, and as a member of the Committee on Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs. He has also served as president of the California Catholic Conference.

A native of Los Angeles, Bishop Blaire was raised in the San Fernando Valley, where he attended local Catholic schools and graduated from Queen of Angels High School Seminary and St. John’s Seminary in Camarillo, before being ordained to the priesthood in April 1967. He served as an associate pastor in the Los Angeles Archdiocese, for 14 years in Catholic secondary education, and as moderator of the curia and chancellor of the archdiocese. He was an auxiliary bishop of Los Angeles from 1990 to 1999, before being appointed as bishop of Stockton.

Bishop Blaire is a very warm, personal, and intelligent man. He is one of 14 children and while he says he’s “lousy at it,” he loves playing golf in his rare free time! He looks forward to meeting you, our parishioners this Monday night!
