Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

April 13, 2014

God greatly exalted [Christ]
and bestowed on him the name which is above every name.
— *Philippians 2:9*

THE ATTITUDE OF CHRIST JESUS

The Lenten cycle brings us to this “mixed” Sunday of palm branches and painful suffering. Our liturgy opens by recalling Jesus’ triumphant entry along the main road into Jerusalem, then moves quickly to the back streets of betrayal and humiliation, the courtyards of torture and abandonment, the hill of execution.

Isaiah’s strange and gripping “Song of the Servant of God” was to become the song of Jesus. It is the song of one who strides forward consistently in the face of criticism, even scorn: “I have not rebelled, have not turned back.” It is to become our song, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

How are we to react when we hear the account of the passion and death of the Lord? Paul tells us that our attitude must be Christ’s, who “emptied himself, taking the form of a slave.” We pray that we may absorb the attitude of Christ, and face life squarely in its triumph and its pain.

**Bishop Jaime Soto will speak on
"The Union of Worship and Charity in the Life of the Church"
Monday, April 14th at 7:15pm, at our parish, St. Teresa**

The bishop's talk is the final talk in a three-part series sponsored by the parish during Lent, titled "Finding Christ in the World: The Bishops' Series, Voices from the Leadership of Our Church."

Bishop Soto, a native Californian, grew up in Stanton and graduated from St. Polycarp School, Mater Dei High School and St. John's Seminary in Camarillo. He holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy, a master's degree in divinity, and a master's degree in social work from Columbia University in New York City. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 12, 1982. As a priest of the Diocese of Orange, he served as director of immigration and citizenship services within Catholic Charities and was Episcopal Vicar for the Hispanic Community.

On March 23, 2000, he was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Orange and was ordained a bishop on May 31, 2000. He was named Coadjutor Bishop of Sacramento on Oct. 11, 2007 and installed on Nov. 19 of that year. With Bishop William Weigand's retirement on Nov. 30, 2008, he became Bishop of Sacramento. Within the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, he has served as chair of the Committee on Cultural Diversity in the Church, chair of the Catholic Legal Immigration Network, a member of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis, and a consultant to the Committee on International Justice and Peace. He currently is chair of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development.

Bishop Soto comes from a large family of 5 brothers and 1 sister of which he is the oldest. He enjoys listening to jazz music in his spare time! **Come and join us in welcoming the Father of our Faith Community, this coming Monday night. NOURISH YOUR FAITH THIS LENT!**
