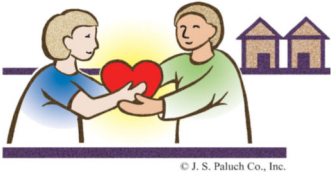

**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
September 21, 2014**

Turn to the LORD for mercy;
to our God, who is generous in forgiving.

— *Isaiah 55:7b*

SEEK THE LORD

In today’s opening reading, Isaiah urges us to “seek the LORD” who is “near” and can be “found” (Isaiah 55:6). Then Isaiah says God’s ways are as high above our ways “as the heavens are above the earth” (Isaiah 55:9). So we search, not because God is hiding, but because our tendencies are so different from God’s ways that we get lost.

How are God’s ways so high above our ways? The example Isaiah gives is that God’s way is to be “generous in forgiving” (Isaiah 55:7). And our way? We try to be “fair.” You hurt me, so then I hurt you back, just as hard. Then, of course, you . . . And on it goes.

In today’s Gospel Jesus teaches that God is not “fair” like that. Instead, God is so generous we can hardly understand it. The same wage for one hour as for a whole day of work? Not fair! “Seek the Lord,” and we might find a God who calls us to be, not fair, but generous beyond expectations.

STILL LEARNING LESSONS

I was home in Ireland for most of August. When I was leaving I had this heavy feeling that I had not spent enough quality time with my sister Mary. It will not happen again, because in the future Mary and I will go away from the home place. When I shared this with my sister she said, "Let's go to Lourdes soon."

Shortly after arriving at St. Teresa's eight years ago I was hoping to introduce a little more silence before the Masses. I remembered the advice I had received from my former pastor MSGR. Nolan, "Don't change anything for the first two years." Later on I was so glad I never imposed the sacred silence I kept hearing from the parishioners "Please pray for Joan/Mary who sits next to me at Church, she is very ill," or some other news about her. Many parishioners spend a lot of time alone and look forward to visiting with their "pew-mates" before Mass. Parishioners usually sit in the same seat every Sunday and their pew friends become like family.

On Monday night we will begin our RCIA program. I am depending on everyone and the Holy Spirit to bring people to the class. I always feel we have over-fished the pond (parish) in previous years. So far, I've heard from no one this year . . . You guys are getting me to pray more fervently. We will begin the class with prayer and then I'll ask them what they like about the Catholic Church? (Being positive) Every year our guests answer by what they like about St. Teresa's; the people here are welcoming, not too many hell-fire and brimstone talks, my wife and kids get so much out of the Mass.... I have no choice, I already volunteer and I see so many good self-sacrificing parishioners.

I love hearing peoples life stories. When people share we all learn. We are called to be God's people, together we become the Catholic Church.

Vigésimo Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 21 de septiembre de 2014

[R]egrese al Señor, y él tendrá piedad;
a nuestro Dios, que es rico en perdón.

— *Isaías 55:7b*

BUSCAR AL SEÑOR

En la primera lectura de hoy, Isaías nos insta a “buscar al Señor” que está “cerca” y puede “encontrarse” (Isaías 55:6). Entonces Isaías dice que los caminos de Dios se elevan por encima de nuestros caminos, “así como el cielo está muy alto por encima de la tierra” (Isaías 55:9). Buscamos, no porque Dios está escondido, sino porque nuestras tendencias son tan diferentes a los caminos de Dios que nos perdemos.

¿Cómo es que los caminos de Dios están por encima de nuestros caminos? El ejemplo que Isaías nos da es que el camino de Dios es ser “generoso en perdonar” (Isaías 55:7). ¿Y cómo es nuestro camino? Nosotros tratamos de ser “justos”. Tú me ofendes, entonces yo te ofendo también. Entonces, por supuesto, tú. . . Y así sucesivamente.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que Dios no es “justo” de esa manera. Al contrario, Dios es tan generoso que no podemos ni siquiera entenderlo. ¿Pagar el mismo salario por una hora que por todo un día? ¡No es justo! “Busca al Señor” y encontrarás a un Dios que me llama a ser, no justo, sino más generoso de lo que nos podemos imaginar.
