**NECESSARY REPETITION**

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain that God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work, but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

**THE ROSARY AND OCTOBER TRADITIONS**

October in our Catholic Faith is known as the month of the Holy Rosary. The saying of the Rosary is a rich source of Grace for the domestic Church and the Church at large. As a parish we look to our Blessed Mother for inspiration and protection. Each morning during October, at 8:10am, before daily Mass, we will pray the rosary.

On October 1st, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Theresa of Lisieux. Her life in the Carmelite Convent was marked by humility, simplicity, and trust in God. When she entered the convent at the age of fifteen she wanted to do something great for God. After reading 1st Corinthians she discovered for herself that 'Love' was the key for all vocations. "O Jesus, my Love, at last I have found my proper calling; my call is Love." She was not always treated fairly in her religious life but in her "little ways" and in her prayers she became a role model for Jesus' Love amongst us. In her autobiography she wrote, "I have found my proper place in the Church, my Mother, I will be Love, and thus I will be all things, as my desire finds its direction." For much of her religious life she was weak and ill. She died of T.B. at the age of twenty-four and less than thirty years later she was canonized by the Church a Saint and the patron of the Church's missions. Parents for years have taken great comfort and strength from St. Theresa of Lisieux, the Saint of the "little ways." All the little ways of our lives lead to perfection if they are done out of Love for God.

October 2nd is the Feast of our Guardian Angel. God in His Providence watches over all of us. There is great beauty when parents teach their children the Guardian Angel prayer and that God has a special angel for all of us, is a very comforting aspect of our faith.

On October 4th we have the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, my favorite saint. We remember his humility and love for God, peace, animals and humanity. Humanity can be an abstraction but he loved the individual person . . . the next he met, the person next to him. Here at St. Teresa's on Sunday, October 5th at noon, we will celebrate his feast day by asking God to bless our animals in St. Francis name. Our animals are a sign of God's unconditional Love for us. Another tradition that is ascribed to St. Francis is the Stations of the Cross.

During the month of October we also celebrate the feasts of St. Teresa of Avila, St. Luke, St. John of Capistrano, St. Simon and St. Jude. Let us keep our Catholic traditions alive. Along with Christ, the Sacraments and Christian living, they enrich our lives and connect us with our fellow pilgrims on the way to God's Kingdom.
