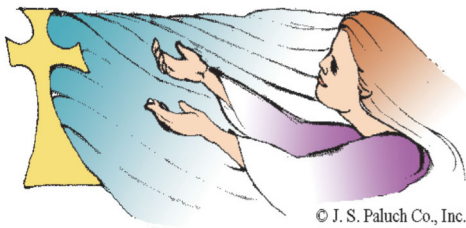

**COME TO THE FEAST**

“On this mountain, the Lord of hosts / will provide for all peoples / a feast of rich food and choice wines” (Isaiah 25:6). That’s what Isaiah tells us today. God is putting together a huge party for “all peoples,” to “wipe away / the tears from every face” (Isaiah 25:8).

And what does Jesus tell us? The reign of God, he says, “may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son” (Matthew 22:2). When the guests didn’t come, the king had his servants go out “into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find” (Matthew 22:9). We are called to deliver that invitation.

One of the themes woven into today’s liturgy is that of divine generosity. Asleep to reality, people often think they have “earned” what they have. In our better moments, though, we know that all our gifts—even the spiritual gifts—come through God’s generosity. Our vocation is to invite people, to remind them the tickets aren’t for sale. We can only show up and say thank you.

**“BELIEVE”**

Believe is the song made popular from the movie “Polar Express”. As a doubting boy boards a magical train headed to the North Pole, we hear the lyrics,

*“Believe in what you feel inside  
and give your dreams the wings to fly.  
You have everything you need,  
if you just believe”.*

But what do we as Catholics think of when we hear the word?

Last Sunday an unusual event occurred during the 10:30am Mass. Some consecrated wine was unintentionally spilled on the transfer of the chalice between the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and the communicant. Immediately our Liturgical Director, Jean Sawyer, stepped behind the altar to take one of the altar linens (called a purificator), brought it to the spill and reverently blotted and then covered it. When communion ended, the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion started to pick up the cloth, but Jean and Father Mike simultaneously told her to “leave it”. What unfolded then was living testimony of faith in action, as the congregation watched Father Mike kneel down at the site, wash it with water, and then take the water back (to be poured in to sacarium in the sacristy).

My grand niece, Sydney, (9) had been singing in the choir, and she, like so many of us, was totally attentive to this intensely spiritual moment. After Mass, Sydney, who made her First Holy Communion here at St. Teresa of Avila just over a year ago, recounted what she had seen, especially impressed by the reverence with which Jean and Father Mike had handled the matter. I asked her why she thought such care was taken. Her response: “Because it is the Blood of Christ.” She did not say, “because it is a *symbol* of the Blood of Christ.” She did not say, “because we *think* it is the Blood of Christ.” She stated that it is the Blood of Christ.

Out of the mouths of babes we hear the consummate representation of the foundation of our Catholic identity. At the consecration, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

It is what we **“Believe”**.

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. Tuvo poco éxito y desanimado pensaba sacudirse de los pies el polvo de aquella tierra y buscar convertir otras gentes. Mientras estaba en oración, María, la madre de Jesús, se le apareció con palabras de consuelo, ánimo y un pequeño obsequio. Le dio una imagen de ella misma sobre un pilar y con el Niño Jesús en brazos.

En esa tierra ella pidió la construcción de un templo donde ella misma sería altar para la gloria de Dios. Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano. De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.
