GOOD NEWS

Lately we have had more than our share of violent news The European plane disaster and Isis. When Christ died it was also so violent, but His saving death broke the death barrier for all of us. “By dying He destroyed our death, by rising He restored our life.” St. Paul said to the Colossians, “You have been brought to life in Christ.” Christ came that we might have life, and have it to its fullness.”

Sin entered our world because of man choosing to sin. God has always been calling us to leave our inclinations to sin behind. The cross shows us Christ’s Love for humanity. His perfect and selfless Love shows us that violence does not have the last word. Sin and violence are put to death on the Cross and by the Resurrection of the Son of God.

Easter asks us to bring this Good News to the world. At baptism each of us are baptized into the priesthood of Christ. This priesthood of service is strengthened and invigorated by each reception of the Sacraments. We are called to be Good News and witnesses to Christ.

Every day and every week I witness the Good News in our midst. Yesterday on the way to the Mass of the Oils I anointed Richard at Auburn Faith Hospital. His daughter attended his dying bedside and said her father could not communicate. Having a strong voice I said, “Richard, can I pray with you this is Fr. Mike.” He opened his eyes for one moment and said, “Yes”. Next I asked him, “Do you want forgiveness?” Again he opened his eyes and said, “Yes”. Finally I told him, “Richard, you have a beautiful daughter.” Richard opened his eyes wider and said his last words “Yes, . . . I do”. Earlier in the week I interviewed students preparing for Confirmation. I asked one girl why she wanted to be confirmed? She answered, “I am energized by my classmates and teachers faith, and I love our Blessed Mother.” Monday night last, listening to this years RCIA class, I knew I was in the midst of The Holy Spirit and Good News.

This Easter will be my ninth at St. Teresa’s. Please God, my tenth year will be one of no complaining. I pray all of us can be Good News to our families and neighbors in Auburn. My Easter prayer is that the peace, light and serenity of Christ will push back the darkness of violence.
