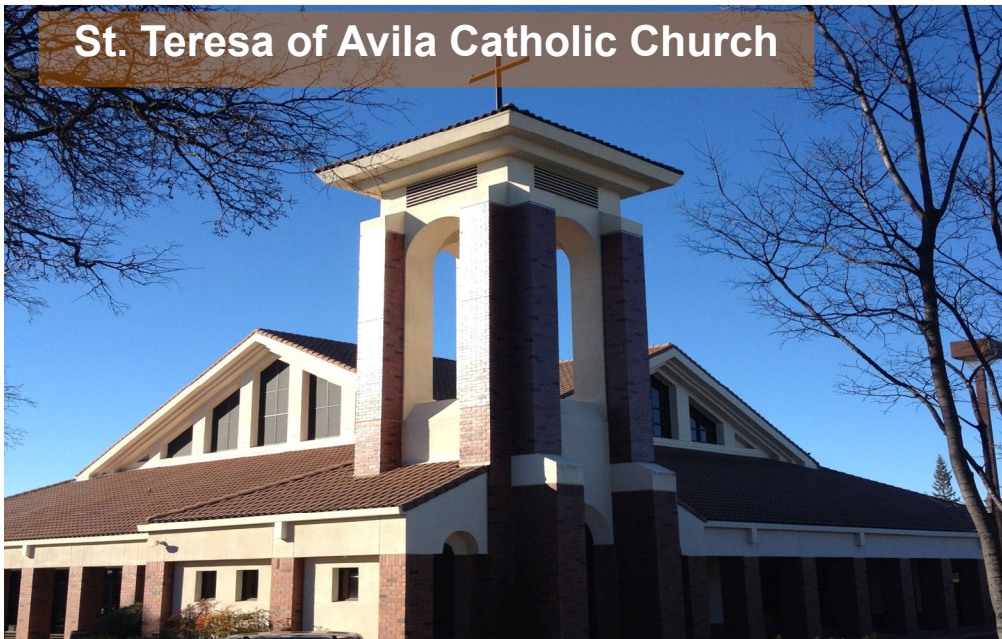

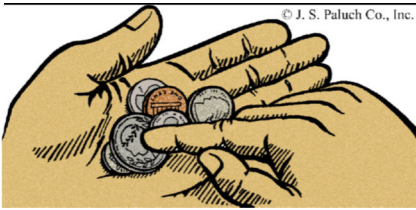

POWER STRUGGLE

Power struggles occur on every level of society, from the world stage to relationships at work, to our own homes. We struggle for position in the hierarchy of power: Who has power over whom? How do they wield it? What is the source of that power? What is the healthy response?

In this Sunday’s Gospel reading the Pharisees engage Jesus in a power struggle over whether Jews should show tribute to Caesar by paying taxes. Jesus’ response puts this and every struggle for power into perspective. In harmony with the words of Isaiah and Paul, Jesus teaches us that God is the ultimate source of all power—the power of earthly rulers, the Pharisees, Jesus, the Church, and the power within ourselves.

After all, the profile of Caesar was clearly imprinted on one side, obviously paying homage to the ruler of Rome, Caesar. We pray for many missionaries who spend their time, talents and energy to spread the Gospel of love and life in Jesus throughout the world. St. Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower, patroness of the Missions, would be quick to tell us that we are all missionaries because we have been baptized and told to go out to all peoples to bring the light of Jesus Christ wherever there is darkness. Mission is about wishing to share the extraordinary gift of faith that God has wished to give us, when He made us sharers in His own life. We must share that gift with others, in our family, in our community or in any part of the world. Let us pray:

"Lord, sent by the Father, you were the first missionary. I thank You for inviting me to take part in Mission; the 'holiest duty of the Church.'
