**SAVED BY THE ONE WHO WAS REJECTED**

Some city teenagers often scorn and reject farm kids. Yet it's no exaggeration to say that humanity owes its life to farmers who care for the world's crops and livestock. This week's scriptures remind us that Jesus was as rejected as a shepherd, a farm boy, yet we owe our very lives to him.

In this Sunday's reading from the Acts of the Apostles Peter tells the people that salvation comes through Jesus Christ, the one who was rejected. In John's letter we hear that we have become God's beloved children through Jesus, whom the world did not know. Lastly, in the Gospel Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd who "lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). Will you join Jesus in laying down your life for God's beloved flock?

## **GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY AND VOCATION SUNDAY!**

Traditionally the Fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. Christ tells us in today's Gospel from St John, "I am the Good Shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me." The image of Christ as the Shepherd is one of the oldest in the Church. Even in the Catacombs there is an ancient drawing of Christ carrying a sheep on His shoulders. Sometimes it is difficult for us to view ourselves as sheep. There is something passive and reliant in that image which may bother our sense of independence. However, if we are honest with ourselves, we know that we need the Lord's help and guidance. We need always to place our lives in the hands of our Good Shepherd.

Throughout this Easter Season we celebrate that one mystery - that Christ gave His life for us on the Cross - If we accept the fact that He is our Savior and that He is our Shepherd, we are better able to serve as shepherds to one another. We must constantly work to live up to the Lord's expectations of us, but we also must always know that He is our Shepherd, our Good Shepherd, and He is always there for us, watching over us and calling us by name. The Gospel of St. John reminds us of the Father's love in sending us His only Begotten Son to be our Good Shepherd and to reveal to us the love, mercy and tenderness of God for us.

Today is also Vocation Sunday. We pray for vocations! Let us pray to the Good Shepherd to send more laborers into His vineyard. For men and women who have a special calling to the priestly and religious life, respond generously to God's call.

Yes, we need good shepherds! Moreover, all of us have a vocation, a calling. All of us are called to be good, to do our mission in this world, and in the end, go to heaven. Life is a mission - not one big vacation - and our mission is service and love!
