**Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord
April 14, 2019**

The Lord God is my help,
therefore I am not disgraced.
— *Isaiah 50:7a*

THE STORY OF OUR REDEMPTION

We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

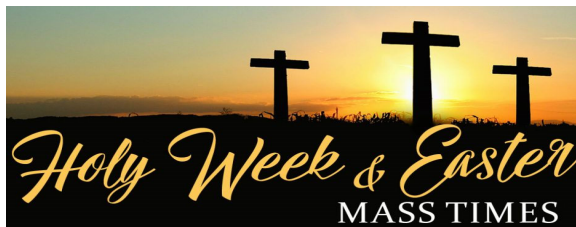

HOLY WEEK

Today, Palm Sunday, is the sixth and last Sunday of Lent and marks the beginning of Holy Week for us. Officially the Church calls this day Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion. There is a dichotomy in that name which we must acknowledge for it reflects in many ways who we are and how sometimes act.

On the one hand is Palm Sunday, a time of celebration which marks Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem. It is a time of joy and celebration and we all festively raise our palms in salute to our King. However, as the readings continue, the mood turns somber with the reading of the Passion of the Lord.

As we stand for this Gospel, and play a part, we call out, “Crucify Him!” What a change, beginning with Hosanna! and ending with condemnation! Although we may be intellectually aware that we are playing the part of the people of Jesus’ time, we really must reflect on whether this also represents how people can be today.

Individually, Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and Good Friday are significant in their own right, but it is important to remember that each day is another step in the journey as one prepares for the holiest day in the Catholic Church, Easter, when Jesus Christ is resurrected.

This week, also known as Passion Week, is another opportunity for God to pour into our hearts the depth of His love for us. Holy Thursday, the day of the Lord’s gift of the Eucharist and the priesthood—Good Friday, the day of the Lord’s Passion and death on the cross—and on Easter, the joy of not just life, but eternal life.

Let us walk the walk together with Jesus this week. Let us pray for one another!

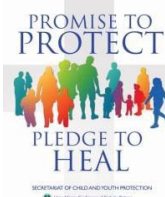

Child Abuse Prevention Month

Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People

The *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* was established by the USCCB in June 2002. It is a comprehensive set of procedures for addressing allegations of abuse of minors. The *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* includes guidelines for reconciliation, healing, accountability, and prevention of future acts of abuse.

The Charter calls for annual audits of diocese and eparchies to ascertain compliance with the USCCB guidelines. The Diocese of Sacramento has been in compliance with all audit requirements since 2003. Compliance is based upon inquiry, observation and review of specifically requested documentation.

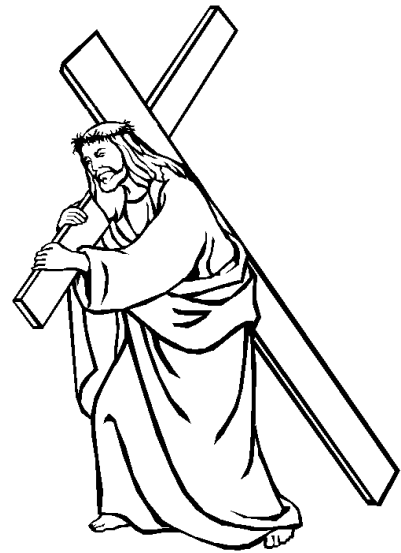

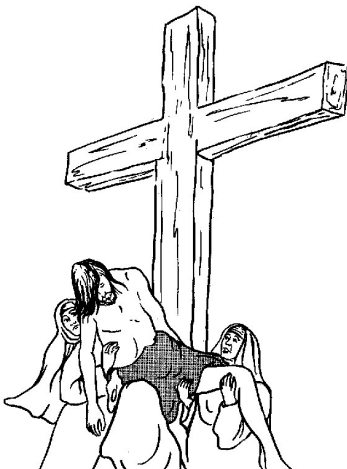
